Carroll Roseberry  
Class of 1931

Carroll Roseberry was born in 1909 and graduated in 1929 from Blackwell High School. He earned an Associate degree in Engineering from Northern Oklahoma Junior College where he was an honor student. He obtained degrees in Mechanical Engineering and Electrical Engineering from Oklahoma A&M.

Married to Roberta Siler, he began his career with Westinghouse in Pittsburgh, studying atomic power and nuclear energy with the developer of the cyclotron. Later he worked on the development of atomic power plants, specializing in nuclear reactors.

Mr. Roseberry became Vice President of the Westinghouse Midwest Region based in Chicago, raising that office from the least productive to the most productive in the United States, and earning the Westinghouse Silver W Order of Merit. He retired as Vice President of Westinghouse. In 1974 he was inducted into the Electric Association Hall of Fame. His civic activities included work with 4-H and Boy Scouts of America. He died in 1990.
