NOC basketball players of the week announced

Greg Krause, Northern Oklahoma College athletic director and women's basketball coach; and men's basketball Head Coach Brett Weiberg announce the NOC basketball players of the week

The women's player of the week is Ana Cruz, a 5-foot-5-inch freshman from Canton, Okla. The men's player of the week is Cortez (Trez) Colbert, a 6-foot-2-inch sophomore from Spencer, Okla.

"During the previous week in losses to Seminole and Eastern, Ana averaged 12.5 points per game. Since Ana was moved into the starting lineup, she has averaged double figures in the scoring column and has given us an added boost offensively. She has especially been effective from the three point line. We're looking for Ana to continue to develop into that shooting guard role throughout the season," said Coach Krause.

The ladies are now 2-9 for the season after Thursday's loss to Eastern Oklahoma State College.

Coach Weiberg said, "Trez Scored 22 points and had three rebounds in a win versus Seminole and scored 12 points and had three rebounds in a loss at Eastern. He had a solid week of basketball. He plays really hard and wants to win. One of Trez's best attributes is his competitiveness. He sets the tone defensively for us every night, and when you couple that with his ability to score the ball, you have a good player. We are going to need Trez to be at his best this week when we play Cowley at home and Butler on the road."

The Mavs, now 12-1 for the season, defeated Seminole State College Tuesday and suffered their first loss of the season to Eastern Oklahoma State College Thursday.

The Mavs play at home Thursday, Dec. 6, against Cowley County Community College; and away Saturday, Dec. 8, versus Butler County Community College at El Dorado, Kan.; the ladies tip off at 6 p.m. and the men at 8 p.m. both days. The Lady Mavs take on Cloud County Community College at home, Dec. 9 at 3 p.m.

ATTENTION: STUDENTS WHO ARE GRADUATING OR TRANSFERRING

Students who have borrowed under the Federal Stafford or Federal Direct Student Loan Program are required by federal regulations to complete an exit counseling session shortly before leaving NOC. If you are not planning to return after the completion of the current semester, you must complete Exit Counseling. Academic records will be placed on hold for those students who fail to do so.

You may complete the Exit Interview requirement by logging into www.nsls.ed.gov

This internet site explains the repayment and deferment options necessary to keep your loan in good standing. You will also need to provide your current address and reference information. The information is sent to the NOC financial aid office and to your lenders and loan servicers.

It is important for you as a borrower to keep your records updated with the lender to avoid default. You can use the NSLDS website to look at your loan balances, determine who your servicer is and find contact information. Many of the Stafford Loans have been sold to servicers so it is extremely important for you to know who is holding your loans to avoid default.

Defaulting on a federal loan can lead to serious consequences such as wage garnishment, withholding of tax return refunds, loss of eligibility for additional federal financial aid, and damage to your credit rating.

You might also want to log into www.studentloans.gov to complete the Financial Awareness Counseling. This website provides tools and information to help you understand your financial aid and manage your finances.

If you need help completing your exit interview or understanding your loan options, please contact the Financial Aid Office on the campus you are attending.


