

Dr. Evans rehired by Board of Regents

The Northern Oklahoma College Board of Regents rehired NOC President Dr. Cheryl Evans at Wednesday's regents meeting at NOC Enid.

Upon conclusion of a short executive session, NOC President Cheryl Evans was rehired with unanimous consent from the regents. Chad Dillingham made the motion, seconded by Jodi Cline.

Hired in 2011 as the first female president in the school's history, Evans has just completed her ninth year serving the institution with locations in Tonkawa, Enid and Stillwater.

"Thank you for the confidence you have shown in me," Dr. Evans said to the regents. "We con-

tinue to work hard for our students during this challenging time. We have a great team at NOC and I appreciate them very much."

The regents were complimentary of Dr. Evans and the NOC staff for their work during the Covid-19 Pandemic.

"You have done a fantastic job during these interesting times," Dillingham said. "You do a great job in normal times but with all the adjustments that have had to be made and made quickly, you have stepped up to the plate and made everything work effectively. I assure you that does not go unnoticed."

Regent Chair Dale DeWitt added, "I appreciate

each and every one of you (NOC staff)."

The Regents approved room and board rates for the 2020-21 school year. Rates will remain the same for 2020-21 at both campuses.

Also, the regents approved the rates for NOC property rentals. There will be a \$5 per month raise in rental properties at NOC Tonkawa and NOC Enid. There will be no raises for

facility rentals in 2020-21.

Regents approved a number of policies including a new telework policy for the Employee Handbook added during the Covid-19 Pandemic.

The regents heard and approved the financial report submitted by Vice President for Financial Affairs Anita Simpson.

The board also heard the recommendation from Dr. Pam Stinson, Vice President for Academic Affairs to rehire NOC faculty for 2020-21.

In other business, the regents approved the meeting dates for 2020-21.

The next meeting will be at June 22 at NOC Tonkawa.

NOC plans in-person classes this fall

Northern Oklahoma College is planning to open all of its locations beginning July 1, college officials announced Monday.

NOC does plan to have in-person classes in the fall, officials are working on plans to ensure the safety and well-being of the campus community. More detailed plans on classes, campus housing, activities, and events will be shared later in the summer.

NOC President Cheryl Evans stated, "We are making plans for the fall semester and working to have a safe return for the NOC family. We look forward to having students back in classrooms and in the dorms."

Most college employees will conclude teleworking and return to work June 1 following social distancing and CDC guidelines. This plan aligns with phase three of the state's re-opening date for all workplaces while also considering the needs of vulnerable populations.

NOC locations will continue to be closed to the public through June 30, but can be accessed by appointment with NOC employees if necessary.

Summer courses are being held this summer via online and synchronous Zoom technology.


Students are encouraged to enroll for the summer or fall semester either by contacting their advisors or by contacting NOC Enrollment Management at 580.628.6220 (Tonkawa), 580.548.2275 (Enid), or 580.628.6910 (Stillwater).

All enrollment appointments are currently conducted by email, via Zoom, or over the phone (please leave a voicemail). Students needing to enroll in person may make appointments through the enrollment management office (see note above). For a complete listing of courses, students should refer to the NOC website.


All college-related events, both on-campus and off, scheduled to occur prior to June 30 are suspended unless otherwise approved on a case-by-case basis. NOC will evaluate adding events for July 1 and beyond at a later date. NOC campuses have been closed since March 30 Due to Covid-19.

College officials said that plans are subject to change with short notice as conditions are evaluated daily.

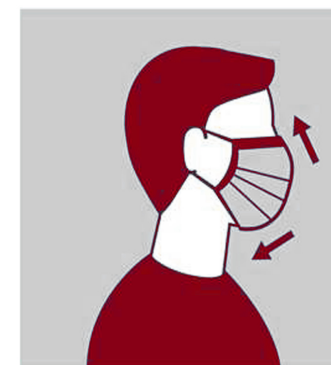

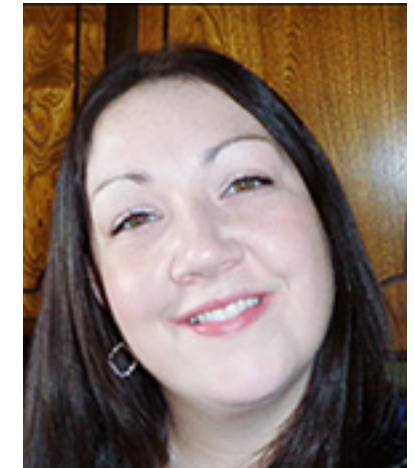

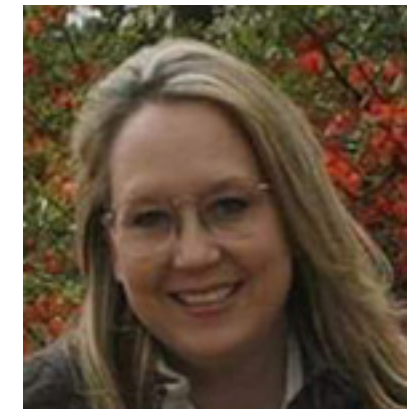
Amanda Shuemaker is a graduate of NOC Tonkawa. She is currently employed at Ecompass Home Health.

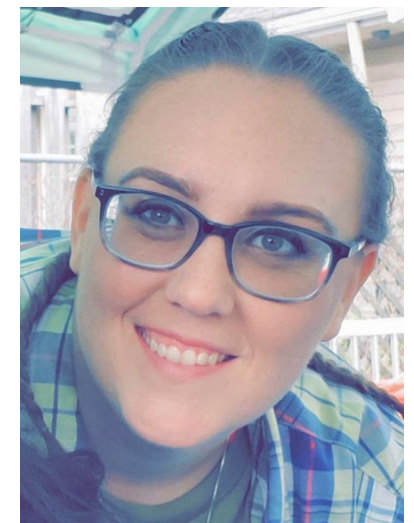

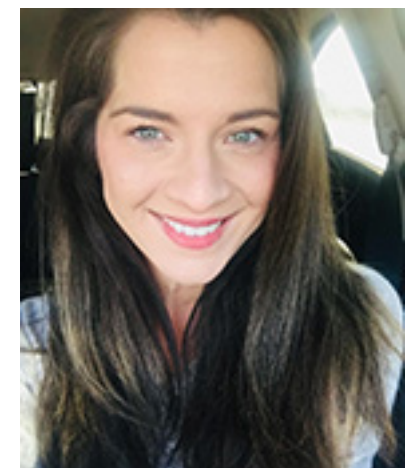
