



Scholarship deadline extended to Feb. 22

The deadline to submit scholarship applications for Fall 2021 at Northern Oklahoma College is Feb. 22.

Applicants applying for the Presidential Leadership Scholarship, the NOC/OSU Gateway Ambassadors Scholarship or the State Regents Academic Scholarship must apply by Feb. 22 at 5 p.m.

According to Sheri Snyder, Vice President for Development and Community Relations, "PLC and State Regents scholarships will be awarded based on the upcoming Feb. 20 deadline. However, priority deadline for all other scholarships, which will begin Feb. 20, is ongoing with scholarships awarded to qualified applicants on a first come, first serve basis until August 25."

For the 2020-2021 fiscal year budget, the college allocated over \$2.7 million in waivers and scholarships support, which is 11.6% of our operational budget. These waivers and scholarships continue to assist our students with academic accomplishments and participation in college activities.

Additionally, through the NOC Foundation during the 2019-2020 academic year, the Foundation awarded over \$245,000 in scholarships

to 392 recipients from the Tonkawa, Enid and Stillwater campuses. So far, this 2020-2021 academic year, NOC has awarded over \$94,000 in scholarships to students.

To be considered for scholarships, applicants are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov (Northern's Title IV Institutional Code is 003162) within 30 days of accepting a scholarship award.

The NOC Tonkawa Mavs are ranked 8th in the latest NJCAA Division I Basketball poll released Monday.

The Mavs (6-0) started the season ranked 12th and have moved up four spots.

NOC hosts Murray State Thursday night, weather permitting and then travels to Western on Monday, Feb. 22.

NOC is led by Tyrel Morgan who averages 17 points per game while JD Ray and Avante Lederer average 15 points per contest.

Morgan leads the club with eight rebounds per game while Ray averages six assists. Ray and Nate Goodlow average three steals per game.

The Mavs (3-1) split a series against Hesston (KS) and then swept Des Moines Area Community College (IA).

2021-22 FAFSA now available

High school seniors and current college students looking for federal and state financial aid to attend college next fall should complete the 2021-22 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible.

“The financial aid staff at Northern Oklahoma College is ready to help students and parents fill out the 2021-2022 FAFSA,” said NOC Financial Aid Director Holly Lee. “Our priority date for consideration for state aid is Dec. 1, 2020. This means students have a two-month window to submit the FAFSA online. It is always better to finish the FAFSA early rather than waiting until the last minute. Students and parents may contact the financial aid office to ask questions or set appointments. Please call 580-628-6595 or email us at financial.aid@noc.edu.”

Lee added that students can still receive financial aid for the spring and summer semesters by filing a 2020-21 FAFSA form.

The FAFSA is used to determine how much financial aid a student may be able to receive to help pay for college. In addition to serving as the gateway to apply for all types of federal financial aid, a completed FAFSA is also required for some state aid, including the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship and the Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant Program. Many students underestimate their financial need or assume they won't qualify for financial aid, but every student should complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1 of the senior year of high school and every subsequent year that financial aid will be needed during college.

“Students who complete the FAFSA have access to numerous state and federal scholarships and grants, work-study programs and, if needed, federal student loans,” said Chancellor for

the Oklahoma Regents for Higher Education Glen D. Johnson. “It is vitally important that high school seniors and our current college students complete the new FAFSA as soon as it becomes available, as some types of state and federal financial aid are awarded to eligible students on a first-come, first-served basis.”

Students can complete the 2021-22 FAFSA online at [FAFSA.gov](https://fafsa.gov) or by using the myStudentAid mobile app. The online FAFSA features skip-logic technology that eliminates irrelevant questions based on the applicant's previous answers, and applicants can choose to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, which will automatically transfer their 2019 tax return information to their FAFSA. To complete and submit the FAFSA online, students and one parent will each need to create a Federal Student Aid ID at [FSAID.ed.gov](https://fsaid.ed.gov). The FSA ID serves as an electronic signature on the FAFSA and certain student loan applications, and allows students to access other federal student aid websites. It is beneficial for families to create FSA IDs before starting the FAFSA to speed up the application process. The U.S. Department of Education estimates the form will take most families less than an hour to complete.

The Oklahoma College Assistance Program (OCAP), an operating division of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, offers free FAFSA materials, tools, and workshops to support school- and campus-based FAFSA education for families across the state. Former Mav dies in accident

A fatality collision Sunday afternoon took the life of former NOC Tonkawa Maverick basketball player Chelvin Webb, 24.

Webb, a 2016 NOC graduate, was originally from Moore, Oklahoma. He was awarded the NOC Jared Weiberg Endowed Scholarship for the 2014-15 academic year.

“Chelvin was one of the hardest working players I’ve ever coached,” said coach Donnie Jackson. “He was an even better young man. Please keep Chelvin and his family in your prayers.”

“The NOC family is saddened by the tragic loss of Chelvin Webb who made a valuable difference during his years at Northern,” said NOC President Dr. Cheryl Evans. “My prayers are with all those who loved him.”

After graduating from NOC, Webb played at Manhattan Christian College in Manhattan, Kansas, where he was currently residing.

The accident occurred during a snowstorm at 1:34 p.m. on I-35 northbound at mile marker 225, approximately 2 miles south of Braman in Kay County.
