



Mavs' soccer starts season off sweep against Eastern Oklahoma State College

Northern Oklahoma College Soccer swept Eastern Oklahoma State College Sunday in the 2021 season opener at Maverick Field.

The Maverick women were 3-2 winners on a header by Milica Bulatovic with :03 left in overtime while the men scored two early goals and held off Eastern 2-1.

Mavs' women 3, Eastern 2

Bulatovic scored two goals while Cory Torres added one to lead NOC to the 3-2 win.

Bulatovic, a sophomore from Serbia, scored the game winner on a corner from Janet Moreno in the game's waning seconds.

"What a game," said coach Michael DuRoy. "We played well. Eastern showed a ton of heart playing with a limited roster in that heat. It was a fun game to watch." Coach DuRoy

"Overall it was a good first game," he said. "We did some things well, and got exposed on some things. We will recover on Monday, watch some film, and work on some things on Tuesday to get ready for a great team coming in on Wednesday."

NOC outshot Eastern 21-9. Goal keeper Jordan Webster had two saves, allowing two goals in the opener.

Mavs 2, Eastern 1

The #17 Mavs were led by Marcovich Brown and Damorney Hutchinson who scored goals less than 2:00 apart in the first half to give NOC a 2-0 early lead.

Eastern scored midway in the second half cutting the lead to 2-1 but the Mavs held on for the 2-1 lead.

The Mavs had a key red card in the first half that changed the momentum of the game according to coach DuRoy.

"The red card killed us," said coach Michael DuRoy. "It's not just that we went a man down for most of the game it's the position that got sent off. We started the game without four center midfielders, two of which would most likely have started the game. Then we get a center mid sent off, and another gets a yellow card. We couldn't trust him not to get another yellow and get sent off leaving us two players down. So, in essence we played the majority of the game without six center mids. That is difficult under any circumstances. Add in the heat and you get what happened today. We were fortunate to win."

"We should learn a lot from this game, hopefully," he added. "This team has a lot of skill and athleticism. We haven't shown a lot of

toughness and self-discipline though. It's nearly impossible to be a great team without those two things, and it's very difficult to teach. We need more accountability and leadership from the players."

Eastern outshot NOC 15-12, goal keeper Harry Archer allowed one goal stopping nine Eastern shots.

NOC offers COVID-19 Vaccine Incentive Contest

Northern Oklahoma College is offering a COVID-19 Vaccine Incentive Program for students and employees.

“The health of our students and employees in our NOC Family is of critical importance,” said NOC President Dr. Clark Harris. “As the cases decreased this summer many people dropped their guard to COVID-19, although we are learning that the variants have increased transmission rates and that people that are testing positive is back to the November 2020 levels. We have learned that people that are vaccinated are less likely to become infected, and if infected the severity of their illness is greatly reduced.”

“NOC wants to help keep you healthy, keep you learning in the classrooms, and allow you to stay active in college athletics and activities,” Harris added. “We can best accomplish this by having as many people vaccinated as possible at all NOC campuses. We are incentivizing this by creating a COVID-19 Vaccination Incentive Contest.”

A student from each campus of the contest will receive a 65-inch Smart TV and another student will receive a 32-inch Smart TV. One employee from each campus will receive a \$500 Pre-Paid Visa while another employee will receive a \$200 Pre-Paid Visa.

Students and employees may enter through Oct. 6.

He said the goal of NOC COVID-19 Vaccination Incentive Contest is to substantially increase the number of fully vaccinated people who are teaching, working, learning, socializing, and living on our campuses.

Study Abroad 2022 Announced

Northern Oklahoma College Global Education and World Geography Instructor Wade Watkins announced seven opportunities to study overseas at NOC.

“One aspect of the college experience students may not have considered, or even heard about, is traveling abroad with a NOC faculty member or two on a short-term study abroad program, where students explore an amazing corner of the world while earning academic credit towards a degree,” Watkins said. “It’s a fantastic way to earn college credit hours while gaining valuable knowledge and experience from exposure to a new country and culture. And it’s easier and more affordable than students think.”

Watkins said NOC has taken more than a thousand students on short-term study abroad programs, to 39 countries, on all seven continents. And for 2022, NOC is offering seven global education programs to choose from. They are:

March 11-18/spring break: **ENGLAND & SCOTLAND*** – 3 optional credit hours of humanities/international dimension

May 18-26: **THE ALPS!*** – 3 optional credit hours of humanities/international dimension

May 21-28: **CUBA*** – 3 optional credit hours of humanities/international dimension

May 29-June 10: **NEW ZEALAND*** – 3 optional credit hours of humanities/international dimension

June 18-30: **NOC BALI SUMMER PROGRAM** – 7 credit hours (4 lab science + 3 humanities/international dimension)

July 3-15: **NOC DUBLIN SUMMER PROGRAM** – 6 credit hours (6 humanities/international dimension)

July 17-29: **NOC LONDON SUMMER PROGRAM** - 6 credit hours (6 humanities/international dimension)

“We hope you have a wonderful semester and give some thought to traveling the world to earn a few of your college credits,” Watkins added. “Students will definitely gain some valuable global experience and knowledge, which will undoubtedly expand their personal, professional, and academic opportunities. Many of NOC’s past participants have noted that their study abroad program was their most influential experience while in college.”

Non-NOC students can join the program as well and earn college credits to transfer to their home institutions. And any of the above programs marked with an asterisk (*) mean that they are one of NOC’s Global Community Programs, which means they are open to students and non-students (the credit hours are optional), so friends or family members can join the global adventure.
