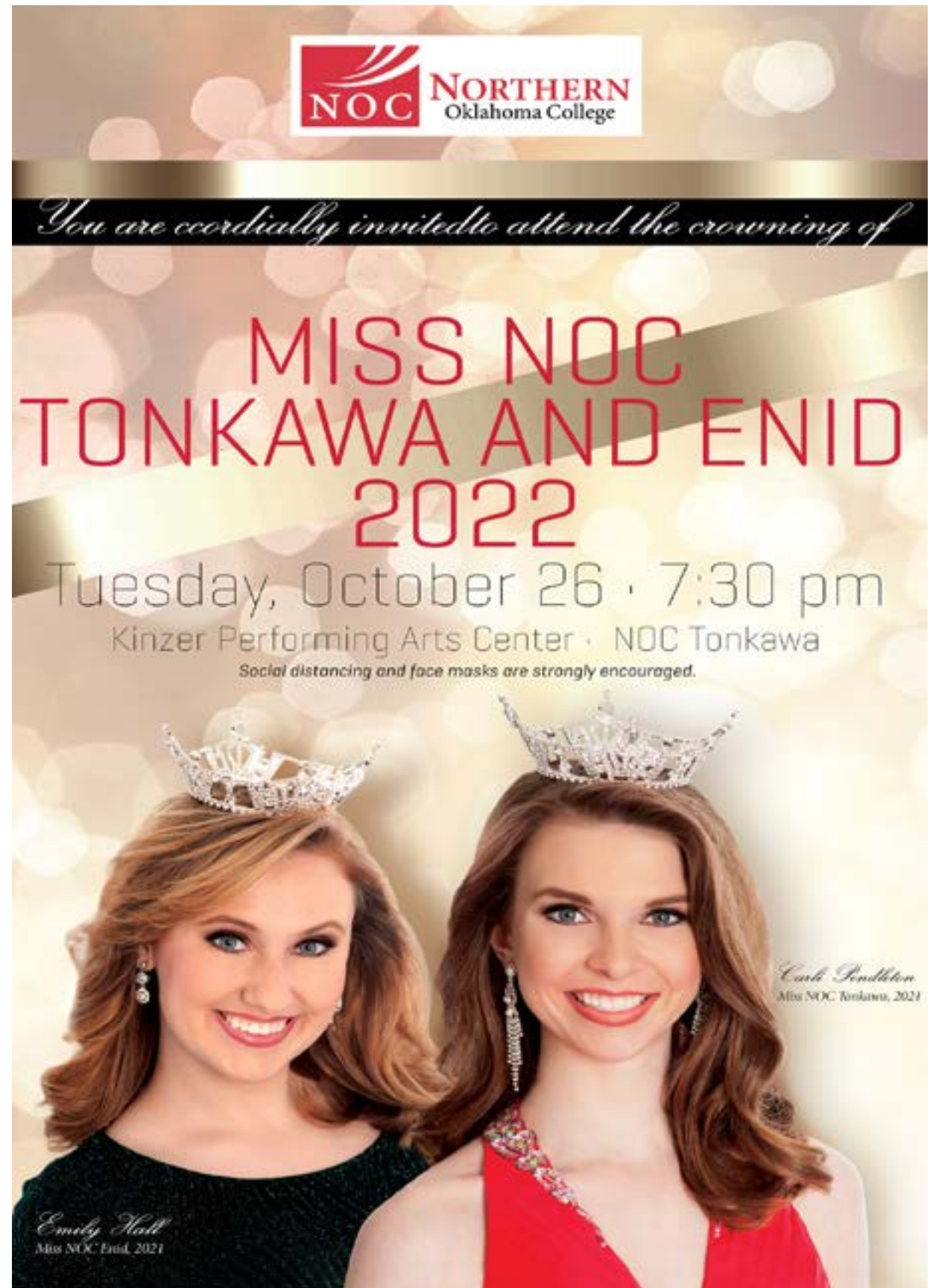

NOC's Dr. Nikole Hicks named to Oklahoma Nursing Board

Dr. Nikole Hicks, Northern Oklahoma College Nursing Division Chair, has been named to the Oklahoma Board of Nursing.

The appointment was made by Gov. Kevin Stitt in late August.

The Oklahoma Board of Nursing was established to safeguard the public health and welfare of the residents of Oklahoma by ensuring that any person who practices or offers to practice registered nursing, practical nursing, or advanced practice nursing in this state is competent to do so.

The board also ensures that any person who practices or offers to practice as an advanced unlicensed assistance person in this state is competent to do so.

The board accomplishes this purpose through the regulation of nursing licensure, unlicensed assistance certification, nursing practice and nursing education.

The purpose, as defined in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act, supersedes the interests of any individual, the nursing profession or any special interest group.

The board consists of 11 members from across the state, six are registered nurses, three are licensed practical nurses, and two are citizens of the State who represent the public. All members serve for a period of five years.

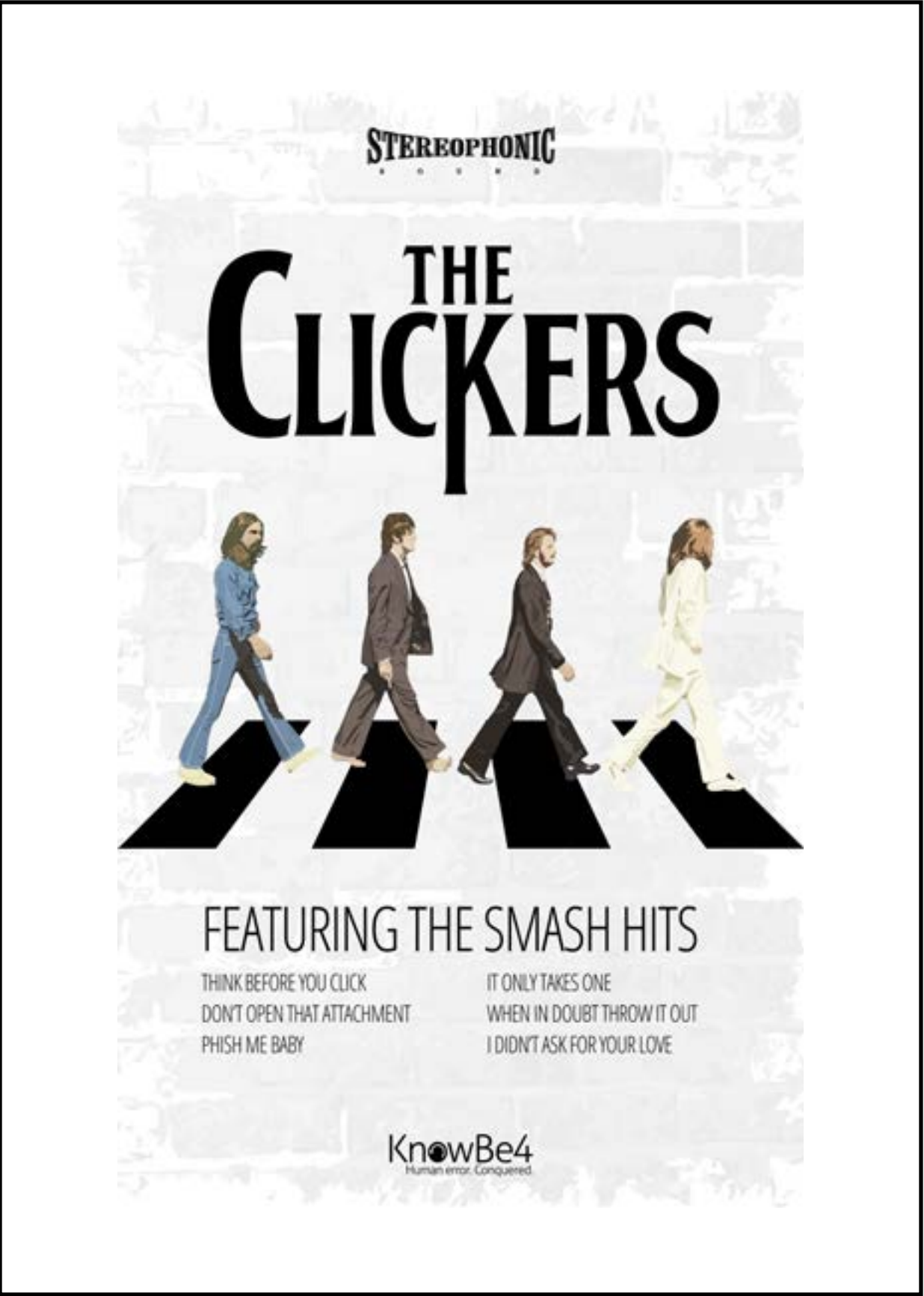
NOC Soccer still ranked in Top 20

Both NOC soccer teams are ranked in the NJCAA's latest Soccer poll. The Maverick women (12-3) are ranked #16 while the Maverick men (11-3-2). NOC closes the regular season this week, the men play their final conference game Sunday against NEO and then close the regular season at home against Bethany on Thursday. The Maverick women host NEO Sunday and then host Redlands Thursday afternoon to end the regular season. The Region 2 playoffs begin Thursday, Oct. 28 in Enid.

Presidential Investiture Oct. 29

The investiture for Dr. Clark Harris, the 14th president for Northern Oklahoma College, will be held Friday, Oct. 29, in the Foster-Piper Fieldhouse on the Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa campus at 2 p.m. The event also coincides with the 120-year anniversary of Northern Oklahoma College. Dr. Harris assumed the NOC presidency on July 1, 2021 following Dr. Cheryl Evans who held the post for 10 years. The tradition of an investiture officially marks the beginning of a new leader's administration. Sometimes referred to as an "inauguration", the investiture is an academic ceremony held to confer the official power of the office upon a new college president, usually held during their first year in office. An investiture reflects academic traditions, celebrates institutional history, and symbolizes a new era in the life of the institution. The ceremony begins with a formal procession, much like a commencement. The procession includes the individuals in the platform party participating in the ceremony, del-

egates from the other Oklahoma colleges and universities, and from NOC faculty. Faculty will wear full academic regalia during the investiture procession and ceremony that follows. The ceremony will include congratulatory remarks from Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, greetings from NOC Foundation Board of Trustees Chair Linda Brown on behalf of supporters of higher education, and the official presentation of the symbols of a high office by president emeritus Dr. Cheryl Evans. The NOC College Choir and Concert Band will perform. A reception will follow the investiture on the circle lawn just south of Foster-Piper Fieldhouse. An invitation-only delegate luncheon will be held at the Renfro Center from 12:00 – 1:30 p.m. The 2 p.m. investiture is open to the public. NOC is limiting capacity to 70% of the maximum indoor facility seating to ensure possibility of social distancing.
