

### **ARP Higher Education Emergency** Relief Fund (HEERFIII)

College received a third round of stimulus funding of \$3,947,651 from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to award as financial aid grants 2021 as of November 11, 2021 will be eligito students and to help support our students' needs and challenges due to the coronavirus HEERF III. pandemic.

The American Rescue Plan was passed by Congress and signed into law March 11, 2021 to provide economic relief from COVID. The grant funds are from the U.S. Department of Education's Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF III) and were established to prioritize students with the greatest financial need.

These funds are similar to the CARES Act funds and the CRRSAA funds that were distributed by the college last year. The funds can be distributed to support any component of the students' cost of attendance or for emergency costs that may arise due to COVID, such as tuition, food, housing, course materials, technology, health care (including mental health) and child care.

Under ARP, a student is now defined as any individual who is enrolled at an eligible institution on or after March 13, 2020, the date of declaration of the national emergency due to the coronavirus, regardless of whether they completed a FAFSA or are eligible for Title IV aid. The HEERF III student aid grants are available to all students, which now includes internation-

> NOC/OSU Gateway Program students billed by OSU will not be receiving ARP funds. They are eligible to receive ARP funds through OSU.

> The ARP emergency assistance funding is federal grant assistance that does not need to be repaid; but it does require institutions to prioritize grants to students with exceptional financial need, such as those who are eligible for Federal Pell Grant funds. Additional information including the estimated amount of your disbursement and the date of disbursement will be sent to students via their email within the next couple of weeks.

> The ARP emergency grant funds will be refunded directly to the students via their Bursar's account without applying the funds to any outstanding balances they may have. If you have not designated your refund option, please go to MyNOC, then under the Students tab, click Billing. The direct deposit designation is in the middle of the page. Please have this completed before midnight on November 30th.


