Pickens Learning Commons Grand Opening set for Oct. 12

The Pickens Learning Commons is receiving ecutive Director to the NOC Foundation Sheri the final touches and NOC will host the grand opening on Wednesday, Oct. 12.

The Pickens Learning Commons is the transformation of the Vineyard Library at Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa to include library services, the testing center, tutoring services, career and transfer services, and the Cultural Engagement Center (CEC).

The space brings several services together for the convenience of students. The space also includes enhanced technology resources, distributed individual and collaborative study spaces, and two stunning murals totaling 100'x20' by artist Yatika Starr Fields, commissioned by the Hugh and Dr. S. J. Pickens Museum.

The museum had earlier commissioned two murals in the CEC by Fields, that were completed in June 2021. There are over 80 pieces of art in the Pickens Learning Commons, which make it one of the most significant art collections on display in northern Oklahoma.

President Clark Harris said, "The entire transformation has been funded by external funding, including a generous donation by the Hugh and Dr. S. J. Pickens Museum. Mr. Hugh Picken's desire to help NOC to be able to modernize the library into a 21st century collaborative study environment for the NOC students is incredibly heartwarming."

"We are so proud of our partnership with Hugh Pickens and the Doctor Pickens Museum, said NOC Vice President for Development and ExSnyder. "We are profoundly grateful for friends such as the Pickens who continue to share their gifts with us."


The Pickens Learning Commons is the first significant project of the Building a Better NOC initiative. The Building a Better NOC initiative has received extensive feedback from students, faculty, staff and community members on small and large ways to improve the college experience for Northern Oklahoma College students, employees and the community.

"The library at NOC Tonkawa was at a pivotal crossroads with rows and rows of outdated books not being used by today's students and there was a need for a modernized library with individual and small group study areas in a dynamic environment," said Dr. Clark Harris. "The library has benefited from a reduction of outdated books, a fresh open feel in the entire library, a new inviting entrance with a smaller circulation desk, new carpet, newly painted walls, upgraded technology resources, new furniture and inspiring art on the walls. This project is a perfect example of connecting NOC's core values of personalized education, continuous improvement and community and civic engagement into one transforming project."

The come and go grand opening will be Oct. 12, from 3:30 p.m. - 5 p.m. with remarks and a ribbon cutting by the Tonkawa Chamber of Commerce set for 4 p.m. The event is open to the public.

Art Exhibit opens in Tonkawa

24 Works on Paper, Oklahoma's only traveling art exhibit that features artists who live and work in the state, will be on view from Sept. 26 – Nov. 4 in the Eleanor Hays Art Gallery at Northern Oklahoma College in Tonkawa.

Artists chosen for the curated exhibit differ in age, background and style and what unifies them is that they all make work on paper - in media such as printmaking, drawing, painting and photography.

The guest curator for 24 Works on Paper was Michael R. Grauer, Curator of Cowboy Collections and Western Art at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum. The biennial exhibition is managed by the Oklahoma Visual Arts Coalition, a statewide nonprofit whose mission is to grow and develop Oklahoma's visual arts community through education, promotion, connection and funding.

The exhibition will travel to venues across Oklahoma including Leslie Powell Gallery in Lawton, from Nov. 12 to Dec. 20, 2022, The Wigwan Gallery in Altus, OK from Jan. 16 to Feb. 24, 2023, Spider Gallery in Tahlequah, OK from March 6 to April 21, 2023, Gardiner Gallery of Art, Oklahoma State University, Stillwater from May 8 to June 16, 2023, Thomas K. 

America. We begin our series by spotlighting those Hispanic Americans in Politics and Government. This, by no means, is an exhaustive list. There are many more, both well known and

Over the next two weeks, more Hispanic Americans will be featured in the sports, art, and entertainment industries.



Sonia Sotomayor

A Bronx native of Puerto Rican descent, Sonia Sotomayor became the first Hispanic American to serve as a member of the Supreme Court. She previously served as an assistant district attorney in New York and stepping away to work in private practice, Sotomayor was nominated to the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York by President George H. W. Bush in scent. 1991 and to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit by President Bill Clinton in 1997. President Barack Obama picked her as his first nominee to the U.S. Supreme Court in 2009.



Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez

Ocasio-Cortez challenged Democratic incumbent Joe Crowley, the first to do so since 2004, and pulled off a surprise primary win in June 2018. Through a grassroots campaign, she became the youngest person elected into the House of Representatives during the midterm elections that year. She is of Puerto Rican de-



Marco Rubio

Marco Rubio was elected to the U.S. Senate representing Florida in 2010. After an unsuccessful bid for the Republican presidential nomination, he was re-elected to the Senate in 2016. A Miami native, Rubio is a descendent of Cuban immigrants.



Ted Cruz

Ted Cruz is of Cuban descent. Cruz quickly entered politics, joining George W. Bush's presidential campaign in 1999 where he assisted in building Bush's legal team during the Florida presidential recounts. He served as Texas Solicitor General from 2003 - 2008. Cruz was elected U.S. Senator of Texas in the 2012 election.

Cruz and Rubio helped to elevate the representation of Hispanic Americans in Congress.

The event is open to the public.


Hope served 24 years in the United States Army including multiple tours overseas with five tours in Afghanistan.

We're proud of the more than 80 government agency representatives and residents who came to the Open Meeting, Open Records Act information presentation at Autry Technology Center on Monday.

Oklahoma Press Association and Oklahoma Attorney General's Office worked together to regularly provide these training seminars across the state. There are several other presentations that will be held in other communities in Oklahoma through the middle of November.

The crowd on Monday was impressive. Included were city officials, law enforcement and first responder officials, county officials, school officials, health care officials and even regular residents who just want to know more about their rights under these important laws.

We had attendees come from cities on the north border near Kansas and all the way west to the Texas border. Their attendance shows that their agencies are taking their transparency responsibilities seriously.

As a press organization, we harp a lot about transparency and following open meetings and open records requirements. We also combat misunderstanding about the laws, and we have to fight to keep the laws as strong as possible so they don't get watered down by lawmakers who may not be as interested in transparency as they should be.

The fact that we had pretty much a full house for the seminar speaks highly of the organizations and officials who care and want to do what is right under the law. We in the press complain about those who don't show interest in complying with the law, as we should.

However, it's just as important for us to praise the public servants who are trying to get it right. We appreciate their efforts, and we thank them for their dedication to ensuring their agency is transparent and deserving of the trust placed in them by their citizens and their constituents.
