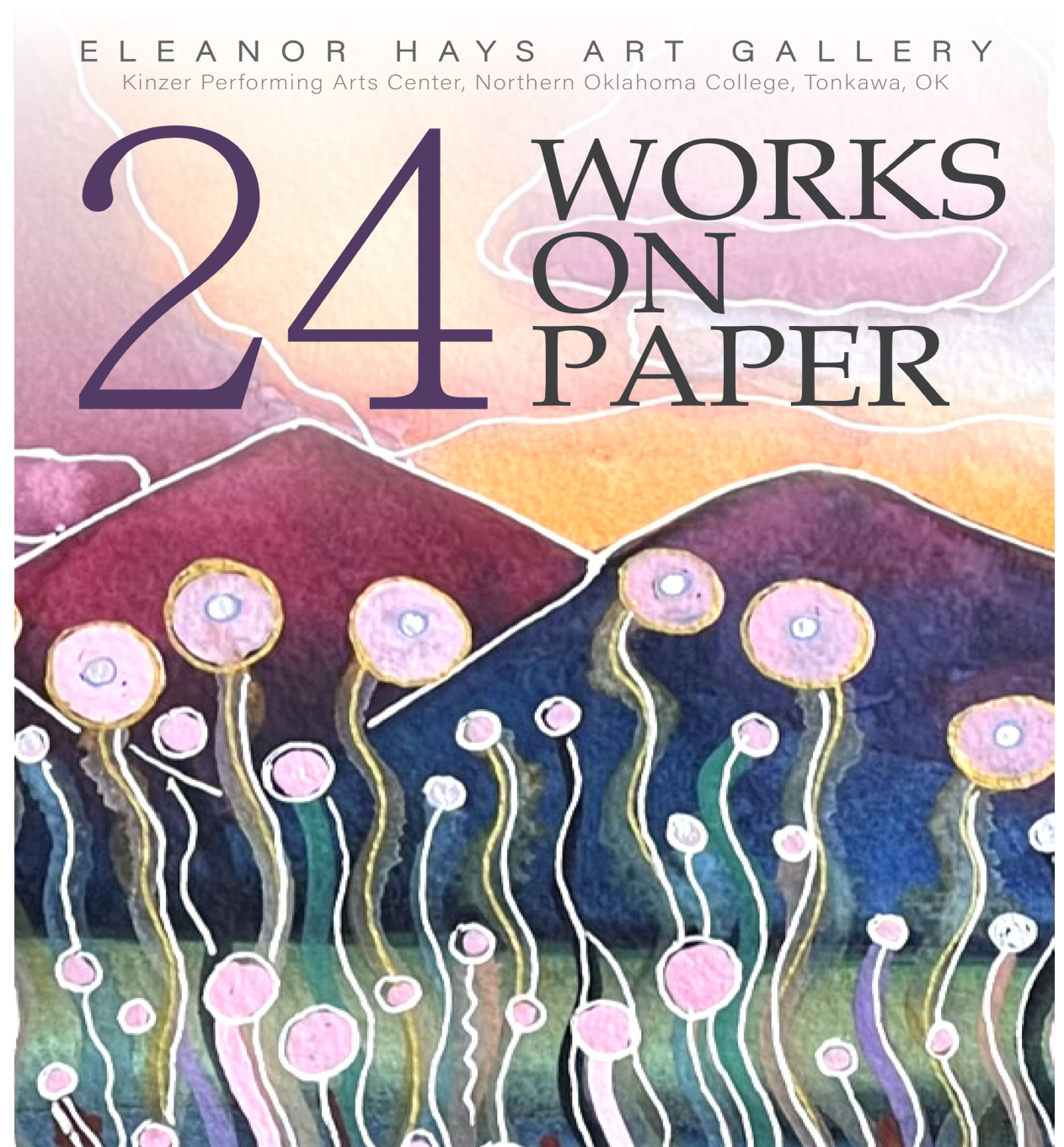

The Criminal Justice Society, as a community service activity, became an affiliate chapter of SAFE (Stuffed Animals for Emergencies). NOC Criminal Justice has the only SAFE Chapter in Oklahoma.

"All stuffed animals were mailed to the club from across the country," Cochran said. "Stu-

dents then sorted, cleaned, sterilized and bagged them up for donation. This meaningful community service wouldn't have been possible without the generosity of those that mailed in stuffed animals, the Tonkawa Hometown Laundry who donated their services and the First Baptist Church in Tonkawa for donating laundry detergent."

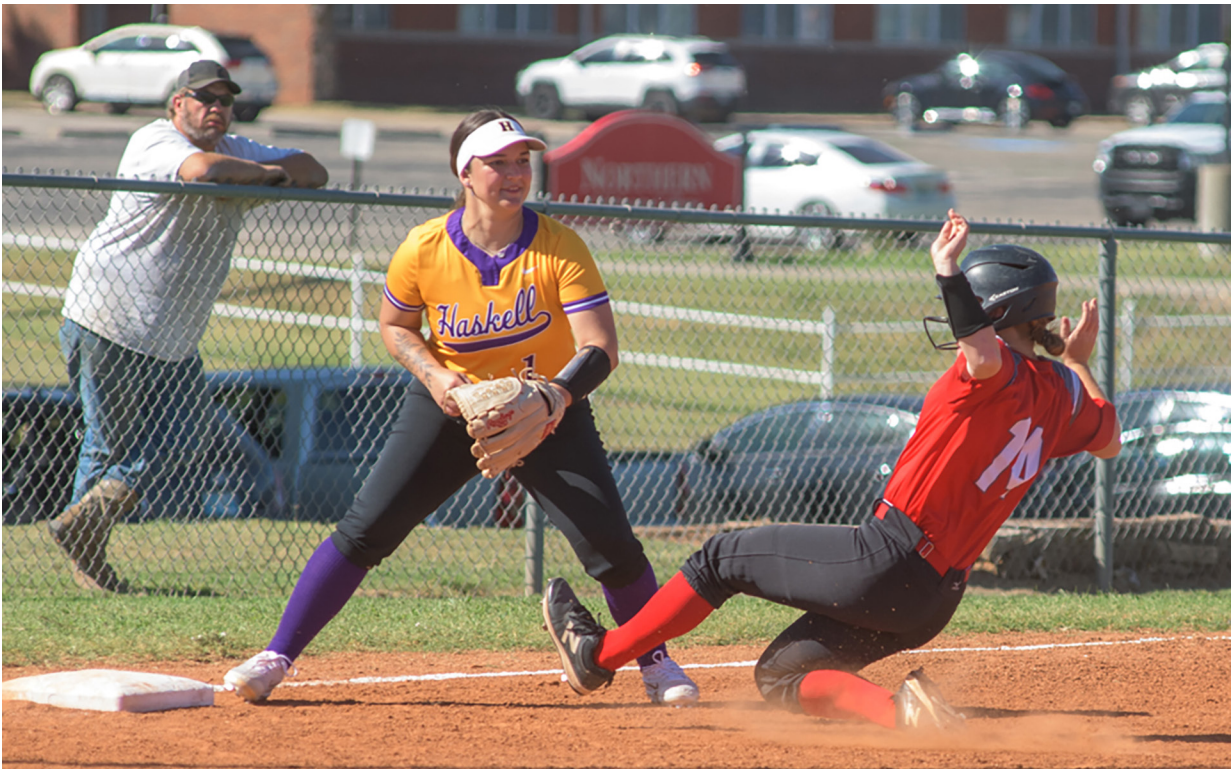
