INVESTING IN THE FUTURE

Founded by 1916 alumnus A. Ray Smith, the NOC Foundation, Inc. was first incorporated in 1961 under the direction of attorney Bob Colombe. In June of 1963, the organization began its first year of operation with NOJC President Dr. V. R. Easterling and NOJC Foundation President Lin Trueblood. Other committee leaders that year included Harold Weigle, Glen Strange, Mac Bradley and Lowell Doggett. Editor of the *Crimson Rambler* was Mac Bradley.

The late sixties marked the beginning of the Greater Gifts Campaign by the Foundation. During Spring 1966, the first eight \$200 Foundation scholarships were awarded to area high school seniors. In 1975, the Foundation set a goal of raising \$10,000 for the Greater Gifts scholarship drive and exceeded that goal by \$1,500. The first Greater Gifts Donor Recognition banquet was held March 3, 1980 in the Maverick Cafeteria.

Thirty years later, the Foundation had amassed total net assets of \$428,928. At that time the NOCF set a goal to raise \$1 million by the year 2000. Thanks to the contributions of alumni and friends of the college, that goal was surpassed in 1999.

Total net assets by the fiscal year end of 2004 reached \$1,834,033, and the Foundation initiated a campaign goal to raise \$3 million in total net assets by 2013. As a result of a Board strategic planning retreat in 2010, the Foundation increased the goal to \$5 million by 2015. Total net assets by fiscal year end of 2012 were over \$6.1 million. Marking its 50th Anniversary in 2013, the Foundation increased the goal to \$12 million in total net assets by 2018. This goal was met in fiscal year 2018-2019.

In October 2021, the Foundation Board of Trustees, NOC Executive Council and key NOC development personnel participated in a day long strategic planning retreat. The retreat focused on year one of a new three year strategic plan that will bring the foundation in alignment with the current NOC five-year strategic plan. The overall goal for year one is to further solidify the foundation's infrastructure to enable continued growth in order to further enhance students, programs, and staff at Northern Oklahoma College through increased fundraising.
