



As the regular season for college basketball winds down, NOC Enid and NOC Tonkawa will be focusing on the NJCAA Region 2 Tournament at Muskogee High School March 8-11.

While the Mavs and Lady Mavs have completed their regular season, the Jets and Lady Jets have one game left, at Connors Monday night.

For the men, the winner of the Jets-Connors match-up will finish second in Region 2. The Jets (11-4) have a one game lead over Connors (12-5) but Connors would hold the tie-breaker so the Jets need a win to claim second place and the #2 seed in the conference tournament.

The Lady Jets (10-5) will finish in third and will be the #3 seed in the conference tournament no matter the result of Monday's game.

For the Lady Mavs, their 12-4 conference record is good enough for the #2 seed behind Murray State. The Mavs (8-8 in conference) will be no worse than the #5 seed in the conference tournament.

The tourney brackets will be released next week for the March 8-11 tournament.


