NOC announces foundation trustees for 2023-24

Northern Oklahoma College Foundation (NOCF) announced their Board of Trustees for 2023-24 as approved by the NOC Board of Regents this summer.

The NOC Regents approved a change in the Foundation's By-laws increasing the number of trustees to 20 for the Foundation adding more community leadership to the board.

Two Regents, Bradley Fox of Ponca City and Jason Turnbow of Enid serve on the Board as well as the NOC leadership that includes President Dr. Clark Harris, NOCF Executive Director Sheri Snyder, Treasurer Anita Simpson, Director of Development & Donor Relations Candy Oller and Director of Alumni and Community Relations Kayla Wooderson.

Community leaders on the Board include Trustees Mark Detten, Brad Purdy, Jodi Cline, and Ken Bellmard from the Tonkawa area. Trustees from the Enid area include Peter Dillingham, LynnDe Funk, Cheryl Evans, and Patrick Anderson. Trustees from the Stillwater area include Dr. Gordon Laird and Patrick Zimmerman. Trustees at-large include Misty Diemer Thurman, Tom Poole, and Jackie Conrady.

Sheri Snyder, Executive Director for the Foundation and NOC Vice President for Development and Community Relations stated, "Our

NOCF Executive Committee believes that we have selected appropriate community leaders from our service areas to assist us in the upcoming years as we explore the vision and future of the Northern Oklahoma College Foundation. We are excited to work together continuing to build our strong foundation in support of the many students and programs at Northern Oklahoma College."

The NOCF currently manages over \$15 million in unaudited net assets and awarded 361 scholarships totaling \$228,450 in the 2022-2023 FY. For this 2023-2024 fiscal year, the NOC Foundation Board has been working with our private donors to increase not only the number of scholarship awards given but also increase the dollar amount awarded. Snyder commented, "The Foundation's goal is to maximize the financial assistance provided to each student through private awards, thus reducing any out-of-pocket expenses for our students. The Foundation has increased scholarship award amounts with an additional \$75,000 in potential scholarship support to be awarded this year to students at NOC."

The purpose of the Foundation enhances the educational opportunities and environment at the college and is organized for the benefit of NOC and its students.

Interim Enid soccer coaches named

Northern Oklahoma College Enid has announced Cesar Zepeda and Aron Bassoff as interim soccer coaches for the 2023 season.

Zepeda will lead the women's program this season while Bassoff will lead the men.

They replace Michael DuRoy who resigned Aug. 25.

"Coach Zepeda has done an incredible job holding things together this past week," NOC Athletic Alan Foster said. "I feel with him taking over as interim women's head coach will allow him to focus more on one team but still assist with the men whom he has some familiarity with. He was put in a difficult position but has performed exceptionally well."

"I am excited to bring someone like Aron to help lead our men's soccer program and assist with our women's program," he said. "His experience as a head coach at the college level in both men and women's soccer is just what we needed in this situation. We were fortunate to get him on board as quickly as we did. I look forward to working with him."

Foster said his concern is for the student athletes.

"As athletic director, one of my main concerns with the transition, especially given the timing, was to make sure that the student athletes continue to have an incredible student athlete experience at NOC. I feel like the re-structuring

of the coaching duties with each team having a head coach whose primary focus is a specific team will be an improvement. Secondary duties of assisting the other team only helps our entire program."

Zepeda, in his second year at NOC, is a 2015 NOC graduate coming from Oklahoma City's Western Heights High School.

Zepeda played at Northern Oklahoma College and then continued his career at Oklahoma Christian University where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Sports, Wellness, and Recreation Management.

He then earned his Masters of Education at East Central University in Sports Administration. Additionally, he is certified in the US soccer national D license.

He coached for years at Western Heights High School before coming to NOC.

"I am pleased to be named the interim women's coach," Zepeda said. "I am excited to have the opportunity to work with this group of players this year."

Bassoff comes to NOC from Alderson Broadus in West Virginia.

Bassoff has extensive intercollegiate soccer coaching experience completing 19 seasons at

the NCAA II, NCAA III and NAIA levels with 18 seasons as a head coach, 13 years as a head men's coach.

"I am very excited to be here," Bassoff said. It is unique set of circumstances that brought me here (his former school closed) but I am deeply excited for a program that I believe has a lot of potential and can accomplish great things both this year and in the future."

He has coached seven nationally-ranked teams across his career, winning three conference/regional championships, and 11 second place fin-

ishes. Bassoff's teams have also produced three Conference Players of The Year, and averaged more than 10 wins a season across his tenure.

Bassoff earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Sport and Exercise Science from Messiah College in Grantham, Pennsylvania and a Masters of Science in Sport Management from Nova Southeastern in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. His successful career has led Bassoff to several institutions, most notably Davis & Elkins, where he guided the Senators to a 47-22-6 record over five seasons.
