The service provides free transit services, loaner laptops, and hotspot access. Students in financial hardship, Marshallese, Hispanic, or the first member of a family to attend college may qualify.

The contribution also supports the NOC student program encompassing digital literacy where NOC personnel will provide mini-workshops on the use of the laptops and other services provided. Training would also include but not limited to website navigation, searches, email, using a PC, getting started with a computer, video conferencing (Zoom), mobile devices, online fraud/scams, accounts/passwords, digital connections, access to MyNOC portal, and more.
