- 3. Reciting of the Northern Oklahoma College Mission Statement. Northern Oklahoma College, the State's first public community college, is a multi-campus, land-grant institution that provides high quality, accessible, and affordable educational opportunities and services which create life changing experiences and develop students as effective learners and leaders within their communities and in a connected, ever-changing world.

- 5. Vote to approve minutes.

- 6. CDBG Grant Resolution.
 - On the motion of Regent Turnbow as seconded by Regent Martin, the Regents voted to approve the CDBG Grant Resolution as presented. The resolution will allow NOC to partner with the City of Enid to apply for a Community Development Block Grant that would fund the beginning of renovations at

Failing Field on the NOC Enid campus. Voting aye were Regents Groendyke, Loftis, Martin, Turnbow, and Fox.

7. Proposed Summer Residence Hall Rates for Tonkawa and Enid campuses.

 Anita Simpson presented the Proposed Summer Residence Hall Rates for Tonkawa and Enid Campuses for approval. Students will be housed in Jets Hall in Enid and Maverick Hall in Tonkawa for \$735.00 monthly. On the motion of Regent Groendyke as seconded by Martin, the Regents voted to approve the Proposed Summer Residence Hall Rates for Tonkawa and Enid campuses. Voting aye were Regents Groendyke, Loftis, Martin, Turnbow, and Fox.

8. Monthly Financial Report.

Greenhouse – American Plant Product – \$149,000.00; Funding Source: NASNTI Grant Funds. (#III.) Four 15-Passanger Vans – Billingsley Ford – Lawton -\$235,120.00; Funding Source: Capital Funds. On the motion of Regent Martin as seconded by Regent Groendyke, the Regents approved purchases for (#I.) Emergency Roof Replacement and (#II.) Greenhouse. (#III.) Four 15-Passanger Vans were tabled to allow more bids to come through. Voting aye were Regents Groendyke, Loftis, Martin, Turnbow, and Fox.

Ms. Simpson presented for approval Section 13/New College Fund 600 & 650 allocation requests for the following projects: Computers & Networking – Tonkawa - \$10,000.00, Computers & Networking – Enid - \$10,000.00, Computers & Networking – Stillwater - \$10,000.00, Computer Hardware, Software, Licenses & Fees - \$10,000.00, Campus Site Development & Physical Plant – Tonkawa - \$10,000.00, Purchase of Vehicles - \$125,000.00, Purchase of Vehicles – Enid - \$125,000.00, Classroom Building – Stillwater - \$15,000.00 On the motion of Regent Martin as seconded by Regent Loftis, the Regents voted to approve the Section 13/New College Fund 600 & 650 allocation request for \$315,000.00 as presented. Voting aye were Regents Groendyke, Loftis, Martin, Turnbow, and Fox.

14. Administrative Comments.

- Sheri Snyder invited the Regents to the NOC/OSU Gateway Program 20th
 Anniversary Ceremony on Thursday, April 18. She noted building tours and reception with a brief program will begin at 3:30 p.m.
- Jeremy Hise gave a brief update on the NOC Global Education trip to London and Paris. There were 28 travelers between NOC and OSU students, parents, NOC alumni, and community supporters. He also announced that NOC Enid Mackie Planetarium will be hosting a watch party for the Solar Eclipse on Monday, April 8.
- Anita Simpson reported that her department has submitted financial indicator information for the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) annual institutional update based on FY2022-2023 audited financial statements. HLC requires institutions to submit two sets of financial data with one set of data excluding the impact of GASB 68 & GASB 75 and one set of data including the impact. For FY2022-2023, the Total Composite Financial Indicator (CFI) Score for Northern Oklahoma College Excluding GASB resulted in a 1.74 which falls in the Above the Zone range of 1.1 to 10.0 for public institutions. She also gave a brief update on the Marshal Tower Restoration and stated that the bid opening was March 12. One bid was incomplete and will be rebidding to attract additional vendors interested in the project.
- Jason Johnson noted that NOC Softball teams are starting Region 2 play this week after a competitive non-region schedule.

15. President's Update.

 Diana Watkins stated that she attended the Rural Community College Caucus at the Capitol on Tuesday where she was one of two presidents who had the opportunity to speak about our campuses. She noted that several Legislators were attending from our area and were able to speak to them individually on certain issues relating to Higher Education.
