NOC grant applications due Sept. 15

The Northern Oklahoma College Foundation is offering grants through the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma Endowment and the Presidential Partners Program.

These funds are made available to Northern Oklahoma College programs, students and employees whose proposed projects support the Foundation's mission of providing quality educational experiences.

NOCF annually determines fund availability and will award grants based on annual earnings of the endowments.

The Foundation will do its best to provide full or partial funding for all requests; however, submission does not guarantee any funding will be granted.

Jets' women open soccer season

The NOC Enid Lady Jets Soccer team opens the 2024 season Thursday at #20 Hutchinson (KS) losing to the Dragons 6-1.

Second year head coach Cesar Zepeda welcomes an experienced group hoping to build on last year's 9-7-3 record.

"We are looking forward to a great 2024 season," Zepeda said. "Our pre-season has been going really well and we are excited to kick off the season. We are looking forward to matching up against whoever our opponent is and working toward a playoff spot."

The Jets compete in Region 2 against Seminole, Rose State, Redlands, NEO, Connors, Eastern, Murray, and Rich Mountain. The Jets were 8-5-3 in conference one year ago. Seminole is the

only ranked team in Region 2 coming in at #3 in the pre-season poll.

"We have a really strong group of sophomores who had a great spring season," Zepeda added. "We played some very challenging opponents but that allowed our players to build chemistry with one another, confident within their own abilities and been in tough games to help furnish their experience on the pitch this fall."

Returning starters for the Jets include Rachel Foster, Rainya Cattina, Kya Cornett, Monika Olivares, Megan Sharp, and Olivia Perrin. Players that are ready to step into starting roles are Jerhyn Lewis, Journey Johnston, Jacey Johnston, and Eeve Jones.

Jets open soccer season tonight

The NOC Enid Jets soccer team opens the 2024 season Friday night at home against Coffeyville (KS) at 6 p.m. at the Advance Soccer Complex.

Men's soccer is under the tutelage of Aron Basoff in his second year at NOC Enid. He led the Jets to an 8-3-5 record after starting with the club after the 2023 season was underway. He was named Region 2 Coach of the Year.

"We hope to get off to a stronger start because of our spring and more continuity in coaching," he said. "Last season we had a great 2nd half to the season so this year if we can combine that with a good start, we should stand a chance to be a top team in the Region."



The strengths of the team include a good group

of sophomores.

"The sophomores had a very good spring where we played some tough games," Basoff said. "They have come back in the fall at a good level and will help bring the freshmen along so leadership and experience are helping a lot."

Enid planetarium show set for Sept. 3

The September NOC Enid Planetarium show at the Mackie Planetarium will be offered on Tuesday, Sept. 3 at 7 p.m.

The September show will present the night sky over Enid during autumn and point out where constellations, planets and other interesting objects may be found in the evening sky.

Osell said the show will highlight features in the southeastern sky in early evening. The planet Saturn will be visible in the constellation Aquarius. Osell will point out stars having

known planetary systems.

The feature show is entitled “From Earth to the Universe.” Visitors will see how astronomy has developed over time and how the view of human’s place in the universe has changed as a result.

Osell said that visitors will take a tour of the planets in the solar system.

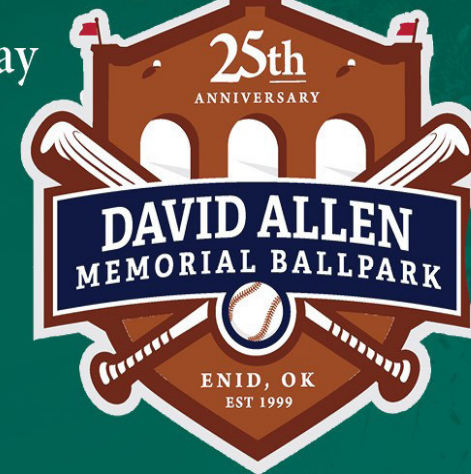
