What makes NOC life-changing?

I would say it is the amazing people at NOC, regardless of campus, that truly enjoy helping and watching others succeed. For example, when I started back at NOC, I was beyond fortunate to have Leslie Johns as my advisor. Professor Johns went above and beyond helping me set expectations, a schedule, and doing everything she could to help me navigate the complexities of figuring out the academic system and my degree plan. I had plenty of professors that took time out of their day or weekend to answer questions about an assignment or something else I struggled to understand. I love NOC because of the people who poured into me to help me succeed.

What advice would you give new alumni and/or students?

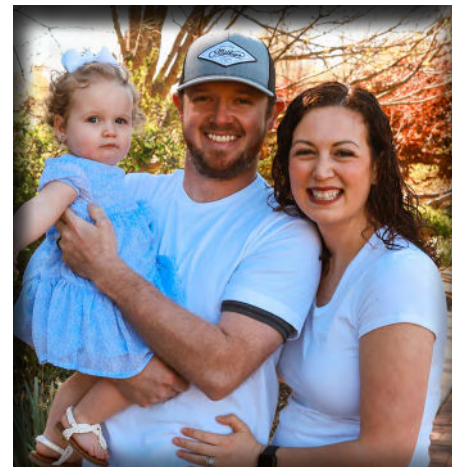
What advice would you give new alumni and/or students?

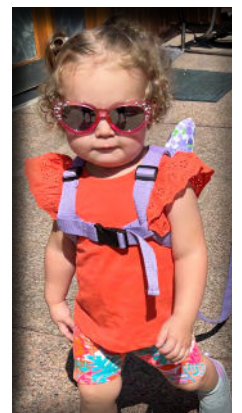

What makes NOC life-changing?

The nursing faculty of NOC is life changing because they took my circumstances into consideration and worked with me through them. From the beginning of the program when my admitting GPA was less than ideal but my references and LPN (Licensed Practical Nurse) program GPA showed what I was capable of, to the final two semesters of the program where I became pregnant and thought I'd have to be out a year to complete my final semester. The staff worked with me, even when I had to go on bedrest due to complications the last month of my pregnancy. It was never ideal for either party, but they made me feel like my circumstances were just another obstacle that they would help me overcome as long as I continued to put in the effort. I gained a lot of cheerleaders and role models through this program.

The NOC Foundation, Inc. acknowledges the establishment of the Dineo Heilmann Legacy Scholarship Fund.

This scholarship was created by former Roustabouts and friends of Dineo Heilmann to not only provide financial assistance to deserving NOC students, but also to honor Dineo for his dedicated leadership of the NOC Roustabouts. His wish is to provide financial assistance to graduating students who excel in music performance and theater tech and who, following graduation, will continue their endeavor to become a professional musician or technician in the entertainment field.

The recipient(s) must be a graduating student at Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa who has participated in Roustabouts as a vocalist, instrumentalist or technician.

Annual earnings and monies donated above the endowment amount will be used to fund the scholarship(s) annually and if more than one recipient is selected, funds will be divided equally between the recipients to provide a cash award up to \$500.00 each to a selected vocalist, instrumentalist, and technician as funds allow.

Through the generous support of Evelyn Coyle, a 1951 Alumna from Northern Oklahoma Junior College, the establishment of this permanently restricted endowed scholarship fund through the Northern Oklahoma College Foundaton, Inc. will provide returning NOC sophomore students an opportunity to complete their educational goals at Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa.

NOC Distinguished Alumna 2021 and long-time Tonkawa resident, Coyle values higher education and it is her desire to help others obtain a four-year higher education degree. She wishes to assist deserving students to be successful in reaching their educational and professional goals.

“At Northern we are extremely proud of the percentage of our students who graduate college with no debt,” said NOC President Diana Watkins. “This would not be possible without the generosity of individuals like Evelyn Coyle. What an incredible gift she is giving to current and future students.”

NOC Vice President for Development & Community Relations Sheri Snyder added, “Every dollar plays an important part in enriching lives and transforming families for generations to come,” she said. “We are so

grateful to Evelyn Coyle for believing in our mission at NOC and supporting our students attending NOC Tonkawa.”

Candidates must be a full-time returning sophomore NOC student with a cumulative GPA of 3.0, studying at Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa.

Preference will be given to student(s) with determined financial need and demonstrate a high level of scholarship aptitude, strong work ethic and good moral character.

There will be no restrictions as to a major of study in determining eligibility for this scholarship; however, preference will be given to students with declared majors in Engineering, Education, Business, and transfer programs in which they are intending to pursue a Bachelor’s Degree. The NOC scholarship committee shall determine the recipient and the NOC Institutional Scholarship office will administer the award.

Investment earnings and donations for scholarship purposes shall be used to provide annual scholarship awards.

NOC establishes First Generation College Student Scholarship Fund



The Northern Oklahoma College Foundation, Inc. announces the establishment of the First Generation College Student Scholarship Fund.

This permanently restricted scholarship endowment fund, created in January 2024, was originated in recognition of and dedicated to the need for financial assistance for selected students who are the first in their immediate family to attend and graduate from a two-year college or university and whose parent/legal guardian(s) do not possess an associate or bachelor's degree.

This scholarship was created and endowed for student(s) who may not qualify for financial aid, but could benefit from additional funding to help offset education-based expenditures.

"As the daughter of a first-generation college student, I am so incredibly appreciative of the generosity of this donor," said NOC President Diana Watkins. "My dad's community college experience completely changed the trajectory of his life, and therefore mine. This scholarship will improve the quality of life for many families for generations to come."

According to Candy Oller, Director of Development and Donor Relations at NOC, the anonymous donor for this scholarship was a student who was not eligible

for financial aid, who paid her own way through college without assistance from family, and struggled immensely. There were many times the donor had multiple jobs to make ends meet, and at times wanted to give up, but did not. The donor is now in a position to help those student(s) who may need financial assistance, and hopefully take some weight off their shoulders. By knowing that someone cares enough to give back, the donor hopes to make their college adventure a little easier.

Applications must be made with the NOC Scholarship Office, be a high school graduate/GED equivalent whose parents do not have an associate or bachelor's degree. Preference will be given to the applicant who demonstrates a financial need, scholarship aptitude and achievement and is full time/part time at NOC Tonkawa

The NOC Scholarship Committee shall determine the recipient(s). Monies raised and/or donated annually for scholarship purposes shall be classified as temporarily restricted and used to provide up to five (5) minimum award(s) of \$1,000 annually. Additional scholarships may be awarded on an as need basis as determined by the Scholarship Coordinator and available funding.

The Northern Oklahoma College Foundation, Inc. is pleased to announce the establishment of the Dr. Robert “Bob” Matthiesen Memorial Scholarship fund.

Through the generous support of the NOC Agriculture and Biological Science Department, this fund will assist high school seniors who have participated in the NOC Ag Interscholastic Contest with the opportunity to achieve their educational goals at Northern Oklahoma College in Tonkawa.

Dr. Robert Lee Matthiesen, affectionately known as “Dr. Bob” was a professor of Science and Agriculture at NOC from 1993 until his retirement in 2004. He dearly loved farming, which he jokingly referred to as his hobby, and he dearly loved teaching at NOC. It gave him great joy to help his students.

He was a “do-gooder” in all aspects of his life. His goal was always to make things better for people he interacted with.

Candidates must be a graduating senior and have participated in the NOC Ag Interscholastic Contest held in March each year. The student must be enrolled as an Agriculture major at NOC.

The NOC Agriculture and Biological Sciences Division will select the recipient while the NOC Institutional Scholarship Office will administer the award.

Monies raised and/or donated for scholarship purposes shall be used to provide a \$1,000 award annually to a full-time student at Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa.

Christopher Storm and wife, Dr. Juliana Nykolaiszyn, have established the NOC Gateway Student Scholarship Fund through the NOC Foundation.

Through the generous support of NOC science instructor Christopher Storm and his wife Dr. Juliana Nykolaiszyn, the establishment of this restricted scholarship fund will provide students an opportunity to pursue their educational goals at Northern Oklahoma College.

“A college education can provide many things, including new beginnings and experiences,” Storm said. “Juliana and I experienced many of the financial issues that many of our students face. We both were in the workforce, barely making ends meet. We decided to go back to college and, through hard work and balancing the needs of being students and workers, ultimately achieved our dreams of Juliana becoming a librarian and me becoming an educator. This would not have been possible without financial assistance.”

“By setting up this scholarship fund, we hope to do our small part in advancing lifelong learning and the career trajectory of NOC/OSU Gateway students,” he added.

“This fund was also created to serve as a readily available option for anybody to assist our great

Northern students attending NOC Stillwater. All alumni, families, individuals, organizations, and businesses that want to assist these students are welcome and fully encouraged to contribute to this great cause,” he said.

NOC President Diana Watkins thanked the Storm family for their generosity and the impact of the scholarship.

“I am extremely excited about the creation of this scholarship for NOC/OSU Gateway students,” Watkins said. “The fact that it was established by a faculty member in our Physical Science Division underscores what I know to be true about our faculty and staff at NOC: they truly embrace our tagline of Life Changing. Assisting college students financially is, in fact, ‘Life Changing.’”

This scholarship, established by the Storm Family of Stillwater, Oklahoma, seeks to empower and support students who are striving to overcome financial barriers and achieve their academic goals. Geared toward the NOC/OSU Gateway Program, the Storm Family is committed to

supporting NOC Stillwater students. The Storm Family's goal is to move toward a permanently restricted endowed fund in the future.

Applications must be made through the NOC Scholarship Office. The recipient must be a non-traditional full-time or part-time NOC or Gateway student and preferably a single parent who has completed 12 academic credit hours including at least one credit hour at NOC Stillwater and have

a cumulative 2.50 GPA or higher. Oklahoma State University students attending NOC Stillwater do not qualify.

The NOC Stillwater scholarship committee shall determine the recipient(s) with input from the Storm Family. The NOC Institutional Scholarship office shall administer the award.

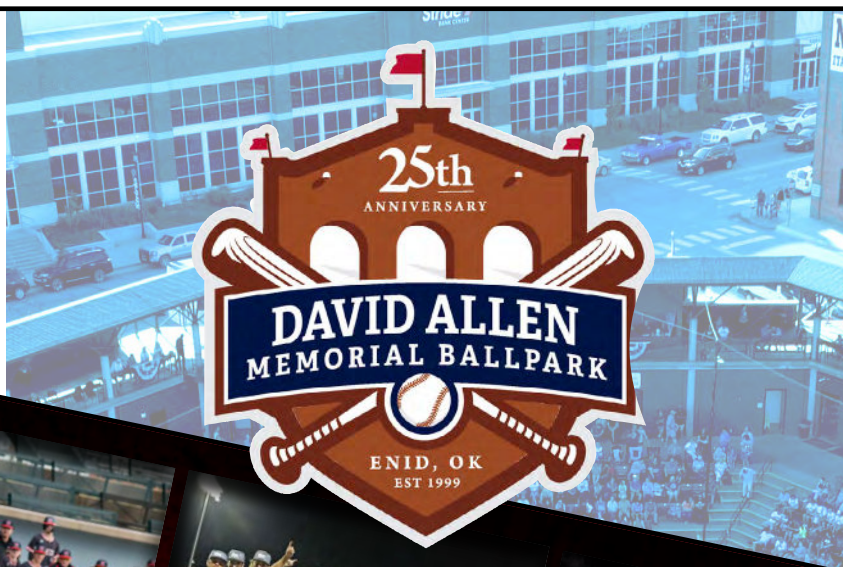
