

This is my first year as an Alumni Advisory Board Member. I like to watch TV shows and movies and love watching sports. I also would like to think I am an outgoing and a relatable person.





25-YEAR CELEBRATION OF NOC ENID



Northern Oklahoma College celebrated 25 years at the Enid Campus Wednesday afternoon with a cookout on the lawn in the center of campus.

"This event recognizes a long-standing partnership in our Enid area community between our outstanding community leaders and other educational partners who believe in the mission of Northern Oklahoma College," said NOC President Diana Morris Watkins. "While the acquisition of Phillips University predates my time at NOC, I am familiar with and grateful for the efforts that many exerted to find a home for NOC in Enid." She then provided NOC's history at Enid.

"To purchase the Phillips University campus, NOC formed a partnership with the Enid Economic Development Authority and submitted a bid of \$5.3 million in April 1999. Of that total amount, NOC provided \$3.8 million toward the transaction while the Enid Economic Development Authority provided \$1.5 million for the Phillips University assets and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education provided an additional \$800,000."

"Community leaders along with City of Enid

administrators and elected officials saw the need for access to affordable public higher education options and were proactive seeking out Northern Oklahoma College to fill a gap," she added. "Since 1988 when NOC first started offering classes at various locations around the city, over 15,500 students have taken coursework at Northern Oklahoma College Enid."

Also in attendance were NOC President Emeritus' Dr. Cheryl Evans and Dr. Joe Kinzer as well as current and former Northern Oklahoma College regents.

NOC faculty and staff were recognized including employees who were employed at NOC when the campus was purchased in 1999.

Other speakers included NOC Enid Vice President Jeremy Hise, NOC Board of Regent Chair Jason Turnbow and NOC Enid President's Leadership Council student Ella Mitchell.




Faces of NOC Enid





Famed author Dr. Eliot Engel revealed the life of L. Frank Baum and the reasons for the enduring and endearing fame of his "Wonderful Wizard of Oz," at Northern Oklahoma College on Tuesday as part of the Fall 2024 Renfro Endowed Lectureship Program.

Dr. Engel used provocative anecdotes, analysis, and large doses of humor in bringing the "Wonderful Wizard of Oz" to life.

The event was sponsored by the Carl and Brenda Renfro/Renfro Endowed Lectureship Program, Charles and Virginia Starks, and Northern Oklahoma College/NOC Foundation.

Engel told many stories about Baum including his upbringing in Syracuse, New York, and how that led him to theatre and writing where he penned the "Wonderful Wizard of Oz." in 1900.

He explained that the story of the Oz fairy tale came from Baum's storytelling to his children in their home in South Dakota. There, he created the story of Dorothy and her three friends who all needed something that in the end, she brought out in each one.

Originally from Indianapolis, Indiana, Dr. Elliot Engel now lives in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he has taught at the University of North Carolina, North Carolina State University, and Duke University. He earned his M.A. and Ph.D. as a Woodrow Wilson Fellow at UCLA. While at UCLA he won that university's Outstanding Teacher Award.

Dr. Engel has written ten books published in England, Japan, Turkey, and the United States.

His mini-lecture series on Charles Dickens ran on PBS television stations around the country. His articles have appeared in numerous newspapers and national magazines including Newsweek. He has lectured throughout the United States and on all the continents including Antarctica. Four plays which he has written have been produced during the last ten years. In 2009, he was inducted into the Royal Society of Arts in England for his academic work and service in promoting Charles Dickens.

For his scholarship and teaching, Dr. Engel has received North Carolina's Adult Education Award, North Carolina State's Alumni Professorship, and the Victorian Society's Award of Merit. Most recently, he was named Tar Heel of the Week for his thirty years of delivering public programs in the humanities and sponsoring state and national literary contests for high school students.

NOC WRESTLING'S FIRST WRESTLING DUAL, MONSTER MASH, A BIG SUCCESS



Northern Oklahoma College Wrestling kicks off the 2024 season with The Mavericks Wrestling "Monster Mash Showdown".

The first dual of the season was held October 31 in the Foster-Piper Fieldhouse against Trinidad State (CO) and honored former wrestling coach and National Junior College Hall of Famer, Bob Zweiacher, along with NOC wrestling alums.

The dual began at 5 p.m. with the women's dual followed by the recognition of Zweiacher and wrestling alumni and then ending with the men's dual. A hospitality room was available for honored guests in the Harrison Room in Foster-Piper Fieldhouse.

Zweiacher started the wrestling program at Northern Oklahoma College in 1968 and is the only wrestling coach in NOC's history.

In NOC's very first year, the team compiled a 10-1 record and finished eighth out of 64 teams in the National Junior College Athletic Association tournament. Between 1968 and 1983 when the program was dropped, his teams finished in the Top 10 of the NJCAA seven times, including four Top-Five finishes and compiled an overall record of 118-37-2.

Five of his wrestlers won individual national titles, including Karl Lynes, a two-time junior college national champion who went on to become an All-

American for Zweiacher's alma mater, Oklahoma State University.

Zweiacher placed second at the NCAA Division I Wrestling Tournament at 167 pounds for the OSU Cowboys in 1964. He was a Big Eight champion and a four-time letterman for the Cowboys.

In 1972, he was named National Junior College Athletic Association Coach of the Year and inducted into the National Junior College Hall of Fame in 1983.

For his contributions to the development of a new wrestling program, Zweiacher was honored with the Lifetime Service to Wrestling Award by the Oklahoma Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2013.

The donors and committee members were instrumental in re-establishing the men's program and establishing the women's wrestling program.

NOC Vice President for Development & Community Relations and NOC Foundation Executive Director Sheri Snyder introduced the fundraising committee and donors that made the wrestling programs possible.


Committee members include wrestling alum Todd Glasgow, Regent Brad Fox, Regent Michael Martin, NOC Foundation Trustee and former regent Jodi Cline, NOC Foundation Trustee Brad Purdy, Wrestling alum and former foundation trustee Ken Bellmard, NOC President Diana Morris Watkins, Vice President for Financial Affairs and Foundation Treasurer Anita Simpson, Vice President for Student Affairs Jason Johnson, Athletic Director Alan Foster, and Biological Science Instructor Dr. Kurt Campbell.

"We would like to take a moment to personally thank all those who have helped in our Fundraising Campaign, from volunteering your time, your service and your financial support," Snyder said. "Thanks to your generosity, we are here tonight with our first wrestling dual in over 40 years. I am pleased to announce that we raised nearly \$200,000 supporting the start-up goals. We are excited that there are so many generous individuals who are passionate about the sport of wrestling, and the student-athletes who will benefit from these new programs at NOC. The banner, which will be hung in the fieldhouse, represents the giving club levels of support with 79 individuals, families and businesses."

NOC coaches Bryan Kenney and Jayden Miller then displayed the banner listing donors and committee members.

"It's wonderful to have the opportunity to recognize those responsible for making the dream of having wrestling at Northern a reality," said NOC President Diana Morris Watkins. "When the NOC Regents approved bringing back men's wrestling and introducing women's wrestling, it was with the caveat that external funds were used to start the programs, so without the support of the individuals and businesses listed on this banner, tonight's Battle of Oklahoma simply would not be happening."

Donors were also given signed wrestling posters to commemorate the event.


