The NOC Division of Fine Arts is hosting the annual Roustabout Homecoming Show on Wednesday, Feb. 5.


The show is set to begin at 7L30 p.m. at the Kinzer Performing Arts Center.

"I like out pitching depth and along with our speed and power on offense," Kissel said. Youth is Kissel's biggest concern.


"We have 22 freshmen so the key is how fast we mature as a team,' he said.

Maverick baseball starts Saturday

The NOC Mavs baseball team opens the season this weekend as the Mavs host Iowa Lakes (IA) in doubleheaders Saturday and Sunday starting at noon each day.

The Mavs are under the tutelage of second year head coach who guided the Mavs to a 42-19 record, the Mavs reached the finals of the Region 2 Tournament.

Keeran is excited about this year's team.

"This group loves competing, they're a competitive bunch and looking forward to playing another team," Keeran said. "We're very balanced and have good depth. We had a great fall, and got some guys healthy. To have (sophomore catcher) Blade Carver (Preseason NJCAA Division 2 Player of the Year) is a nice thing too." In looking at the team's strength, Keeran pointed to the starting rotation.

"Although we had the #1 offense in the country last year for our level and are known for our offense, our starting pitching 1-4 is incredibly talented," Keeran said. "All four are committed to very good four-year programs. (Camden) Edge, (Nakni) Anna, (Logan) Taylor, and (Jacob) Culp are as good as they get at this level.

They need to get better outing to outing though for us to get where we want to be."

The Mavs have to replace a number of position players from last year but Keeran isn't concerned.

"We just to need to get the early jitters out of the way and play free," he said.

The projected line-up for the Mavs includes Will Johnson (SS), Jadan Boyce (RF), Blade Carver (C), Christian Stratis (LF), Aidan Zakarewicz (DH), Joseph Canzoni (3B), Carson Taylor (2B), Hendrick Vandermeer/Kingston Hangartner (1B), and Eric Harper/Braylon Watson (CF). Others expected to contribute include Robert Evans (C), Bill McCarter (IF), Caleb Watkins (OF), and Bodie Amberson (IF).

The rotation will be Camden Edge, Nakni Anna, Logan Taylor, and Jacob Culp with Aiden Hansen set to close. Other bullpen pieces include Liam McKinney, Kaegan Baker, Evan Rollison, Garrett Folmar, Kolby Heskett, Rylan Newman, Grayson Brown, and Collin Berry.

"Region 2 is one of the toughest region in the nation," Keeran said. "it is extremely deep."



"Coming off a strong first fall together I think we've finally started to believe that our best is good enough to compete with anyone," Ray said. "We just need to bring it every time out. I know we will play hard and aggressively. And, I know we'll play for each other. We don't have a large roster so it will take everyone."

Ray says the strength of this year's team is all across the board.

"I think we're good enough offensively to never be out of game and I think we have the potential to possibly be special defensively over the course of a season," he added. "Pitching was an unknown coming in but if we can stay healthy, we will have four solid pitchers in the rotation and Ke with two lefties and two righties."

Rays' concern is depth.


