NOC wrestlers off to Nationals in Council Bluffs

For the first time in 41 years, Northern Oklahoma College competed at the NJCAA Wrestling Championships.

And for the first time ever, the Lady Mavs competed in the Women's Invitational Tournanament.

The two day tournament started March 7 in Council Bluffs, Iowa.

The Mav and Lady Mav wrestlers received a send off Wednesday at Foster-Piper Fieldhouse for the 17 women and four men.

"You are representing yourselves, NOC, and




your communities, he added. "While wrestling is an individual sport, you are wrestling for something greater than yourselves. Always remember that when you compete."


While at Northern he coached football, men's and women's basketball, track, tennis and golf.



Singles or families making less than \$75,000 per year qualify for the free service.

Trained tax preparers from the NOC Business Division and area volunteers will be available for tax assistance beginning on specific Thursdays starting Feb. 13. Taxpayers also have an option to prepare their own basic federal and state tax return using the free e-filing software.

Cara Beth Johnson, Business division chair said, "This is a great opportunity for our students to provide a community service and gain tax preparation experience."
