Spring enrollment begins Monday

Spring Enrollment for Northern Oklahoma College begins Oct. 12 on all three campuses. The spring semester begins Jan. 19.

NOC will continue to offer multiple course formats for Spring 2021 with options to match the students' learning style while continuing to follow CDC guidelines for a safe learning environment. Course options include traditional in-person classes, live online, and completely online.

Students may enroll in-person from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. on all three campuses.

Dr. Pam Stinson, Vice President for Academic Affairs said, "Classrooms are set up to follow social distancing guidelines for in-class sessions, and campuses are being further equipped with technology needed to expand distant education options should safety guidelines require a transition to online. Keeping our students and employees safe will be our top priority."

Students may enroll for spring courses by either contacting their advisor or NOC at 580.628.6220 (Tonkawa), 580.548.2275 (Enid) and 580.628.6910 (Stillwater).

NOC is delaying the Spring semester one week, now set to begin Jan. 19. Late 12-Week courses begin Feb. 15, and Late-8 Week courses

begin March 15. NOC has eliminated Spring Break; the semester will end May 6.

Summer 2021 enrollment will be held at a later date.

All NOC students, staff, faculty, contractors, vendors, suppliers and guests must continue to

wear a face covering (mask) on campus property.

NOC changes spring academic calendar

Northern Oklahoma College is making several adjustments to the 2021 Spring Academic Calendar.

"Based on consultation with local health officials along with a Memo of Understanding with a partner institution, NOC will adjust the start date of the spring semester in order to match schedules as required with our partner and to give us the best chance to finish the spring term in-person," said NOC President Dr. Cheryl Evans.

Evans said that Winter Break will be extended and spring classes will start on Tuesday, Jan. 19 and NOC will not have a traditional spring break in March 2021 in order to avoid another possible surge in COVID cases due to student and employee travel. This approach should allow NOC to finish the semester as originally scheduled.

More details of the spring schedule and important dates will be shared after approval at the Oct. 21 Board of Regents meeting.

NOC had previously approved the transition to online instruction and final exams after the Thanksgiving break for the Fall 2020 Semester.

Northern Oklahoma College is offering enrollment for late-start classes for the Fall 2020 semester.



Northern Oklahoma College is seeking nominations for the 2021 NOC Distinguished Alumni Award.


Nominations are due Nov. 2, according to Kim Ochoa, alumni relations coordinator.

SPRING 2021 COURSE OPTIONS

In-Person

- Courses meet at designated times on one of NOC's campus locations.
- Instructors are available for live instruction/office hours to assist with classroom questions, tutoring, and/or advisement.
- Institutional attendance requirements must be met with in-person presence.
- Students interact with the instructor and other students in the classroom setting and may engage with peers and staff in other social settings, including through clubs and organizations while maintaining social distancing.
- A selection of coursework (including most labs, Fine Arts classes, HPER classes, and other coursework for which activities rely more or in-person instruction) will be offered in this format with a contingency plan in place to move to online should CDC safety standards
- Social distancing guidelines will be applied with assigned seating to limit risk.
- As needed for distancing, courses such as lab sciences will alternate days of attendance and virtual

Live Online Classes

- Courses meet at designated times (synchronous) but students access courses through clicking on a Zoom link.
- Students may request appointments via Zoom during instructor office
- Institutional attendance requirements are met by students connecting during scheduled class time or in some cases with in-class attendance with social distancing guidelines followed.
- Students are able to see the instructor and most classmates on the compute screen in individual windows, and instructors can share their teaching screens with students to see what would have been on whiteboards in traditiona classroom settings
- Students interact with the instructor and other students online during real class time, engage in classroom discussion to ask questions of the instructor or other students, and can use the Chat function to post questions.
- For lab science courses, labs may be integrated into class as a virtual or "complete at home" option, or students may be required to attend an onsite lab session as noted in schedule.

Online Classes

- Courses are taught through the Blackboard learning management site, where instructors may post any of the following: course notes. class videos, assignment sheets, etc.
- Institutional attendance requirements are met by students submitting work and participating in online discussions.
- Students have deadlines throughout the course but do have some flexibility in when to access materials and complete assignments
- Students do not typically interact with the instructor or other students in real time, but may use online tools such as the discussion board for online interaction and be asked to read and respond to classmates'
- Instructors are available via email for questions about course material.
- For lab science courses, all labs will be either virtual or "complete at home.*

FAFSA filing period underway

High school seniors and current college students looking for federal and state financial aid to attend college next fall should complete the 2021-22 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible.

The FAFSA is used to determine how much financial aid a student may be able to receive to help pay for college. In addition to serving as the gateway to apply for all types of federal financial aid, a completed FAFSA is also required for some state aid, including the Oklahoma's Promise scholarship and the Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant Program. Many students underestimate their financial need or assume they won't qualify for financial aid, but every student should complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1 of the senior year of high school and every subsequent year that financial aid will be needed during college.

"Students who complete the FAFSA have access to numerous state and federal scholarships and grants, work-study programs and, if needed, federal student loans," said Chancellor Glen D. Johnson. "It is vitally important that high school seniors and our current college students complete the new FAFSA as soon as it becomes available, as some types of state and federal financial aid are awarded to eligible students on a first-come, first-served basis."


Students can complete the 2021-22 FAFSA online at FAFSA.gov or by using the myStuden-

tAid mobile app. The online FAFSA features skip-logic technology that eliminates irrelevant questions based on the applicant's previous answers, and applicants can choose to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, which will automat-Call the NOC Financial Aid Office at ically transfer their 2019 tax return information to their FAFSA. To complete and submit the FAFSA online, students and one parent will each need to create a Federal Student Aid ID Building Room 106B (Enid), or in the NOC at FSAID.ed.gov. The FSA ID serves as an electronic signature on the FAFSA and certain student loan applications, and allows students to access other federal student aid websites. It is beneficial for families to create FSA IDs before starting the FAFSA to speed up the application process. The U.S. Department of Education estimates the form will take most families less than an hour to complete.

> Campus financial aid offices can confirm school-specific deadlines and provide assistance to families during the application process. There's no charge to complete or submit the FAFSA, so students and parents should be wary of organizations that charge a fee for these services.

> The Oklahoma College Assistance Program (OCAP), an operating division of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, offers free FAFSA materials, tools, and workshops to support school- and campus-based FAFSA education for families across the state.
