NOC grant deadline set for Sept. 15

The Northern Oklahoma College Foundation is offering grants through the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma Endowment and the Presidential Partners Program.

These funds are made available to Northern Oklahoma College programs, students and employees whose proposed projects support the Foundation's mission of providing quality educational experiences.

NOCF annually determines fund availability and will award grants based on annual earnings of the endowments. Please find attached the Foundation Grant Policy and Procedures and the request forms for the two funds.

The request forms are to be completed and returned to the Office of Development and Community Relations.

The Masonic Endowment request is to be used exclusively for student support. Deadline for consideration is September 15. Presidential Partners funds may be used for student or employee support. Presidential Partners may be submitted any time during the year.

The Foundation will do its best to provide full or partial funding for all requests; however, submission does not guarantee any funding will be granted.

When planning for grant requests, please remember to reference NOC's Pandemic Response Plan for any event planning and travel

guidelines.

The test has been authorized only for the detection of the IgG antibody against SARS-CoV-2, not for any other viruses or pathogens. Blood drives will be managed according to CDC safety recommendations. Test results will be made available post-donation.

Tonkawa community needs assessment survey information needed

The Native Alliance Against Violence (NAAV) is collecting information for needs assessment data for the Tonkawa community. The coordinator of the NAAV project is working on a grant for domestic violence transitional housing. They need 100 respondents for the need's assessment.

The NAAV is a non-discriminant program that helps domestic violence victims ages 18 and older regardless of race, color, or national origin. They are a brand-new program that will focus on transitional housing, training, and strategic planning.

The program will target Tonkawa tribal members, residents of Tonkawa, and Tonkawa students and employees of NOC. They are seeking information on the availability of resources and services for victims of crime in Tonkawa.

The response to the 15 questions on this survey will help the program best assist victims, develop a community-focused strategic plan

for future funding, and improve services for crime victims.

Participation is completely voluntary and participants may choose to not reply to any question on this survey. Responses will be kept anonymous. Choosing to reply to this survey will be seen as voluntary consent to this process.

This project is supported by grant number 2018-VO-GX-0168, awarded by the Office for Victims of Crime, Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice. 
