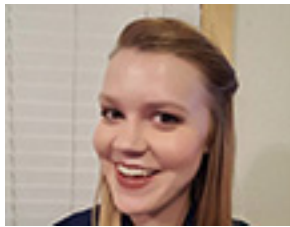

*Donors ages 16 or 17-years old need parental consent to be screened for COVID-19 antibodies and are not eligible to donate convalescent plasma. **This test has not been FDA cleared or approved. It has been authorized by the FDA under an EUA (Emergency Use Authorization) for use by authorized laboratories. The test has been authorized only for the detection of the IgG antibody against SARS-CoV-2, not for any other viruses or pathogens. Blood drives will be managed according to CDC safety recommendations. Test results will be made available post-donation.

Ndiaye added to NOC soccer staff

Assane Ndiaye has joined the Mavericks Men's and Women's Soccer staff.

Ndiaye joins the staff following his position as a Volunteer Assistant Coach for Garner Webb University's Women's Soccer Team. During his time with Garner Webb, the team placed runner-up in the Big South Conference.

Before joining Gardner-Webb's staff in 2019, Ndiaye volunteered with the men's soccer program at Centre College in 2018 following three seasons coaching at the high school level.

While at Centre, Ndiaye was responsible for managing the team's video analysis program and statistics, as well as assisting with coaching and recruiting and performing administrative duties. He helped lead the Colonels to a 14-4-3 record, including an 11-1-1 record at home and a Southern Athletic Association Championship and NCAA Division III Tournament At-Large bid.

Ndiaye spent time with Clinton County High School in Albany, Kentucky guiding the CCHS boys' soccer program to its first ever 15th District Championship match and its first ever

appearance in the regional semifinals.

Prior to his time at Clinton County, Ndiaye was an assistant at Cookeville High School for two seasons. During this time, CHS won the 2016 and 2017 District 6 AAA Sectional Championships and made their first appearance in the Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association (TSSAA) state semifinals.

As a native of Senegal, West Africa, Ndiaye spent his teenage years in soccer academies in both Senegal and France. He went on to try out with Marseille of French Ligue 1. He was a captain at Sacred Heart School. Ndiaye holds his F, E, and D licenses from the U.S. Soccer Federation.

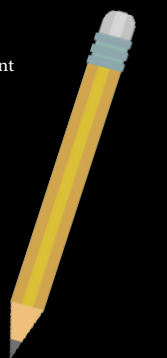
