NOC announces basketball attendance policy

Northern Oklahoma College has released its attendance protocols for the 2021 basketball season for Enid and Tonkawa.

According to the protocol, no fans will be allowed for the start of the spring basketball season in January. For spring schedules, view athletic websites at www.nocjets.com (Enid) or www.nocmavs.com (Tonkawa).

Following NJCAA, and CDC guidelines Northern Oklahoma College will follow the protocol listed below for fans for the 2021 men and women's basketball season starting Feb. 1. All participants will adhere to Northern Oklahoma College Pandemic Policies.

Facemasks will be required at all times while in the fieldhouse. Those in attendance need to maintain social distance of at minimum 6 feet and use hand sanitizers.

To comply with NJCAA Region 2 Guidelines, the gymnasium will be limited to 25% of maximum seating capacity. Due to distances required around the team benches, cheer squad, and pep band, the maximum number of fans allowed in the gym for each game will be 165 people in Tonkawa and 180 people in Enid.

There will be no general admission or season tickets issued.

Each student athlete including cheerleaders will receive two complimentary passes for each contest. NOC coaches must provide the office

of athletics the completed pass list by 9 a. m. on gameday or the Friday before weekend games. NOC coaches and athletic administration will be allowed two tickets per game to share with recruiters or others. Advance requests for press passes for sportswriters and photographers will be honored.

There will be 20 tickets available through a lottery system each game for NOC students and NOC employees to be placed on the pass list. There will also be a lottery of 20 tickets for community members and friends of the College. Those wishing to be in the ticket drawing should email Leeanna.bowling@noc.edu.

NOC will provide the required 20 tickets per team for visiting opponents. These visitors will sit in a designated area. If remaining seats are available on game night, fans will be admitted on a first come, first served basis until the capacity is reached.

Each guest will submit to non-contact temperature screening of less than 100.4 to be allowed entrance to venue. Guests must present an ID to match the name listed on the pass list to receive a complimentary bracelet to be allowed admission. The bracelet must be worn and visible throughout the contest. The bracelet only allows admission to games on a specific date.

Concessions will not be available this season

and there will be no food or drink allowed in the gym. Guests will enter the main doors and exit the designated exit following contest. Tonkawa; Guests will exit Southeast doors. Enid Guests will exit Northwest doors.

A separate set of guidelines is in place for athletes, coaches, officials, and the scorers' table per NJCAA Region 2 rules. These guidelines are shared with these respective groups.

To ensure the safety of our students, staff, and visiting teams Northern Oklahoma College respectfully requests guests attending the games

to fully cooperate with the protocols described above.

Lady Jets open season Jan. 27

It's challenging enough to be a first-year head coach but then throw that in the middle of a Pandemic.

That's the challenge for first year-head coach Kelli Jennings who takes over for long time head coach Scott Morris.

The Lady Jets open the season Jan. 27 against Mid-America JV at 5 p.m. at the Mabree Center.

"I really appreciated the girls that have stayed and work hard daily," Jennings said. It's hard when the coach you were recruited by leaves and somebody new and completely different comes in. It's also been tough because I still don't have an assistant and I know it can wear on the girls hearing the same things from the same person, so I'm grateful they've chosen to stay the course and be a part of this team."

The Lady Jets have a number of returnees from 2020 including Madelyn Hankins, Lauren Wade, Abbey Phibbs, Hollie Wood, Cayti Moeller, and Alexis Pack. Jennings is hoping to build around the sophomore group.

"The returning sophomores that have stayed have been great," Jennings said. "There's a maturity that I see in them and a confidence that you hope your sophomores have. When I watch film from last year, I feel like these girls have really grown and stepped into their new roles well."

What does Jennings see as the team's strengths? "One strength I see is the friendships amongst the girls," she said. I believe there's a genuine enjoyment of each other and it shows on the court. I think another strength is going to be our defense. I feel like we've come a long way since day 1, and our defense should be solid. We talk often how offense has off nights, but your defensive effort and positions can always be controlled."

Jennings does say that depth is going to be a concern.

"I think our biggest concern is our lack of

depth. We have never had a big team (in numbers) and any time a new coach comes in, there's always turnover. With only two freshmen that started the year, and one of those has had knee surgery, we just don't have the numbers to be deep."

The lack of depth, however, does bring opportunity.

"Because we are such a small team in numbers, there's a chance each girl that is suited up on the bench plays in the game," she said. "For us this year, it's truly going to be a team effort to win games, but I also believe that's an advantage to us. When a team is balanced and doesn't depend on just one girl—it means it can be anybody's "big game" any night."

Covid-19 has been a challenge for Jennings and her team.

"The first semester was difficult to ever get in to a rhythm because we would have one or two in quarantine, or the whole team would have to be in quarantine," Jennings said. "It was hard to develop any team concepts or team chemistry when you felt like there was a constant disruption. We are hoping that once season starts we can get in to the flow of things, but always be ready to adapt and remain flexible with what comes."

Jets entertain OnPoint tonight

The NOC Enid Jets open the 2021 season Friday, Jan. 22 at home against OnPoint.

The Jets are coached by Chris Gerber who replaced Aaron Butcher in September.

Gerber is in his 4th year in the program which has helped with the transition of the program.

"It's been easier for sure having a comfort level with the players," Gerber said. "It's different being the head coach but having recruited the players makes a huge difference."

Plus, throw in a Pandemic and it's been a crazy off-season.

"We are learning to go day to day," he said. "As a coach, I have learned you have to adapt and be flexible and this season has put that to the test. We've talked all year about just being in the moment not just from day to day but from morning to afternoon because it can change so fast. We know as the year progresses, things are going to happen and we have to adjust and keep moving forward."

The Jets have scrimmaged North Arkansas and Butler this year with Gerber being pleased with the NOC effort in each.

"Our energy has been great," Gerber said. "Our players are so excited to be competing, they have played with a high energy level. Defensively, we've been good but we've been over aggressive. We want to be aggressive but we've fouled too much, it's something we're working on. Offensively, we've shared the ball and been unselfish and that shows the attitude of our group."

The Jets' return four from last year, Ikenna Okeke (Top 5 pre-season player in Region 2), Jalen Stamps, Andrew O'Brien, and Abe Rodriguez.

"They have been great leaders for us," he said. "They have brought energy every day and led by their actions on the court. I appreciate how hard they have worked and how they have accepted the challenge of leadership in our pro-

gram."

Gerber said all four bring something different to the table.

"Ikenna (Okeke) can do it all," he said. "He has the ability to lead us in every category. Jalen (Stamps) has been taken his game to another level as a point guard that can score. Andrew has matured from last year, his game has improved in every phase. Abe is just Mr. Reliable, he is a steady influence for our team and is a player we trust."

Three transfers are on the Jets' roster including Teyon Scanlon, Noah Jordan, and Tydarius Fish.

"They each bring something different to the table," he said. "All three will help us this year. I'm excited to see how they progress through the year. It's an adjustment for them at a new school but they have a year of college experience and that means so much."

Gerber also expects a contribution from freshman Dakota Joachim and Alex Raiford, although Raiford has been out of action.

"I'm just so proud of our guys, it's not easy when you coach leaves after the season starts but they have stepped up and brought the energy every day in practice," Gerber said. "We are so excited to get out there and compete."
