Willie Spears speaks to NOC students

Spears had a simple message to NOC students by using NOC as an acronym for "Navigating Obstacle Courses."

He explained that obstacles are part of life and have to be navigated.

"Those are things you don't plan for," he said. "But they are things that you have to navigate and things that are part of life. The important movie. thing is to plan for what you can."

Spears gave some advice to students.

"Listen to old people," he said. "They are trying to help."

"Why would you listen to someone that's 18 years old over your mom who is 48?" he said. "They have already made it through what you are going through. Listen to them, they can help you avoid the same mistakes they made at

He also encouraged students to take advantage of the time they have.

"Time flies," he said. "It seems like yesterday that I was where you are, in college, thinking about tonight or this weekend. Time goes fast

Author and motivational speaker Willie Spears so make sure you have a plan so that 20 years spoke to Northern Oklahoma College students from now, you are living the plans you made. You don't want to look back and say what you should have done. Do it now."

> He also told NOC students to "Begin with the end in mind."

"Every decision you make today affects your future," he said. "I am already thinking of when He talked about his son who at age four was I am 70 years old. I want to be able to play with my grandkids when I am 70 so I take care of myself so that I'll be able to be a part of their lives. I love ice cream but I know I can't eat it every day and be healthy when I am 70."

"Your life is literally a movie," he said. "You are the director, producer, writer, and lead actor so write your own ticket. You are in control of your actions and the actions you take today are going to affect everything in your future."

He also told students to not be afraid to put the work in saying that "hard work is the ingredient."

"All the top people in their professions have put the work in," he said. "Successful people are not lucky, they have worked hard to get where they are at."


Webster is a HPER Athletic Training major who graduated from Hilldale High School in Muskogee, Oklahoma.

NOC hosts Northern Encounter at Enid


Northern Oklahoma College will be hosting high school students for Northern Encounter at NOC Enid on March 31.

The Northern Oklahoma College Spring Lectra n s c e n d tureship, featuring Grammy Award winning songwriter Jimmy Webb has been tentatively rescheduled for Tuesday, September 28, 2021.

The event is sponsored by the Carl and Carolyn Renfro Endowed Lectureship Program and Northern Oklahoma College. Webb will appear Park, By the in the Kinzer Performing Arts Center.

Webb was scheduled to appear April 8 and Phoenix, and then rescheduled for October 8 and then again April 22 but the event was postponed due to Covid-19.

"While many possibilities were weighed in composer, regard to the varying federal, state and local Webb writes guidelines with social distancing, continuing with the event in April would mean that a good percentage of people would not be able to come sic and is the only hit maker to have scored to the Lectureship event," stated Sheri Snyder, Vice President for Development and Community Relations and Executive Director of the NOC Foundation. "Therefore, we have decided to move the event to the fall semester with hope that things will be back to normal, rather than disappoint anyone who would not be able to fully participate in a Renfro Lectureship event Within the Sound of My Voice), Art Garfunkel as we are accustomed to."
