

Regents set dates for Town Hall for president candidates

The Northern Oklahoma College Board of Regents met Wednesday at the Renfro Center in Tonkawa providing an update on the search for a new NOC president.

Regent Chair Jodi Cline reported that the Presidential Search Committee has met and has more meetings planned for next week.

She said that from an original 22 applications, the search committee is in the process of narrowing the list to three applicants.

Cline said the three finalists for the position will meet with NOC employees and community stakeholders for a meet and greet and Town

Hall on April 20, April 21, and April 23.

Current President Dr. Cheryl Evans is retiring June 30.

In other business, the regents heard a report from Vice President for Financial Affairs Anita Simpson reported that residential housing rates will not change for the 2021-22 school year. Simpson also reported to the regents that NOC's annual financial report submitted to the Higher Learning Commission was a positive ratio in the zone required by HLC for the fiscal fitness of the institution.

Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. Pam

Stinson reported that the modified in-person graduation is set for May 1. There will be two ceremonies at Tonkawa scheduled for 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. and for Enid/Stillwater graduates at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. The Nurses' Pinning for all three campuses will be at Briggs Auditorium at 7 p.m. at NOC Enid.

Vice President for Development & Community Relations Sheri Snyder reported that the Distinguished Alumni Induction ceremony held March 27 went well and that plans are currently underway to hold modified in-person events for graduation, academic award banquets, em-

ployee service awards, and employee retirement recognition.

Vice President for Enrollment Management Dr. Rick Edgington added that enrollment letters have been sent to prospective students for Fall 2021 and also high school students were contacted in regards to Concurrent Enrollment. He said 7,800 letters were sent to prospective students and 4,400 letters were sent to high school students promoting concurrent enrollment.

The next meeting is Wednesday, May 12, at the Renfro Center at NOC Tonkawa.

Pickens Museum Displays Route 66 Murals by Robert Hardee at NOC

Robert Hardee is well known throughout the Ponca City area through the many exhibited prints of his “Ponca City Landmarks” painted from 1985 through 1993. The prints can be found hanging in many businesses and homes throughout the area.

Hardee’s historic landmark paintings include the Arcade Hotel, Downtown Ponca City featuring the Poncan Theatre, the old Rock Island Depot, the early day Ponca City Library; City Hall, which includes the statue of Marland, the Marland Mansion, and the Marland Grand Home. All prints are limited editions and most

of the earlier prints are sold out but occasionally come up for sale on Ebay over thirty years after they were created.

Now Pickens Museum is displaying two large murals by Hardee, who passed away in 2008 at age 55. The two murals called “Route 66” and “Route 66 Roadhouse” are on display in the Vineyard Library/Administration Building at Northern Oklahoma College in Tonkawa.”

“These two murals were originally commissioned for a restaurant in Ponca City and on display at the Pickens Museum in Ponca City.

play in their dining room,” says Hugh Pickens, Executive Director of Pickens Museum. “When the restaurant went out of business about 15 years ago, we had the opportunity to purchase the two murals for our collection.”

Hardee’s paintings are characterized by bright colors, which the artist obtains by using a technique which he says is “reminiscent of an early Flemish technique.” First, an under painting is made using acrylics in shades of brown-gray and white. About two dozen layers of paint are applied to a sketch to obtain the necessary subtleties in shading. Then, three to four layers of translucent oil paint are glazed on top of the underpainting.

Several months are required to accomplish the technique. Hardee was an adopted member of the Ponca Nation. When not painting, teaching or riding a horse, Hardee could be found at White Eagle visiting his Ponca relatives.

Hardee graduated from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago with a bachelor’s degree in

fine arts. He was a department supervisor at the University of Chicago Regenstein Library and taught an adult education course for the Field Museum of Natural History. Hardee taught art in Tulsa Public Schools beginning in 1995. He later became the visual art instructor at Booker T. Washington High School, where he taught the international baccalaureate art program. He also tutored in American Indian education programs and taught art classes for Indian children. He was an artist in residence for the Arts Council of Oklahoma for 10 years.

Hardee’s philosophy was that knowledge gained becomes most worthwhile when it is shared with others, especially younger generations. This is one reason why teaching was so important to him. At the same time, it was equally important to Hardee to continue to live as a working artist. “This creative path has chosen me,” wrote Hardee, “and the creative force which comes from within is a gift not to be taken for granted.

Graduation exercises set for May 1

Northern Oklahoma College will host in-person graduation exercises for the 115th NOC Commencement on Saturday, May 1, at the NOC Tonkawa and NOC Enid campuses.

NOC will host two ceremonies at the Enid and Tonkawa campuses to comply with mask and social distancing requirements.

Tonkawa graduates will participate in exercises at 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. in Foster-Piper Fieldhouse while NOC Enid/Stillwater graduates will hold exercises at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. in Briggs Auditorium in Enid.

Providing the Commencement address will be President Dr. Cheryl Evans, who is retiring

from NOC on June 30.

“We are pleased to be able to host in-person modified commencement ceremonies for these individuals who have worked so hard to reach their academic goals,” Evans said. “Especially after all the challenges these students have overcome during the pandemic, we are really excited for this group of graduates to celebrate their achievements and to actually experience walking across the stage to receive the diploma that they have earned.”


Caid Glowacki receives NOC Foundation Legacy Scholarship

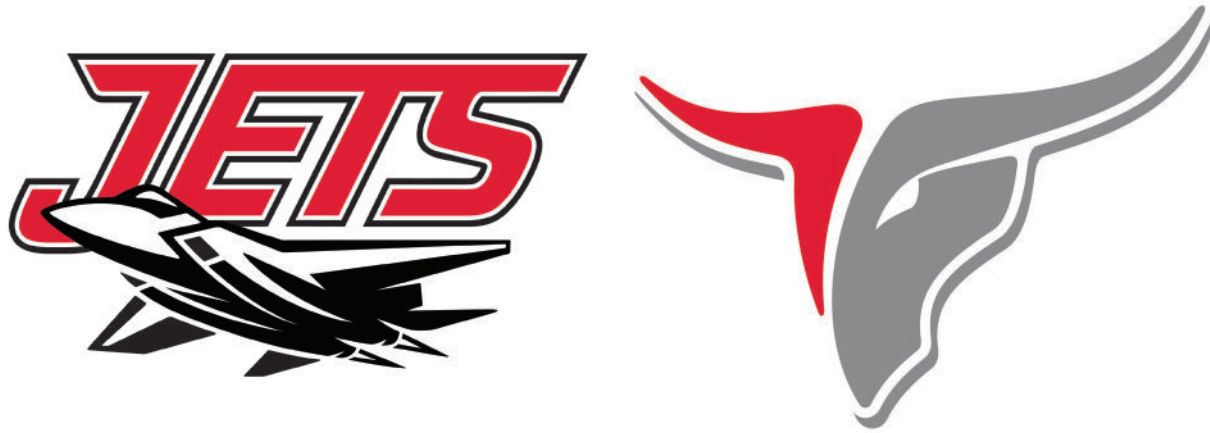
