Alumni & Friends Reunion set for Saturday

Kreger and Tara Tucker Vaughn will be inducted into the NOC Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame March 26.

Vaughn, Class of 1989, will be honored in ceremonies taking place during the NOC Alumni and Friends Reunion Dinner in the Renfro Center at NOC Tonkawa at 5:30 p.m.

Also, the Classes of 1970, 1971, and 1972 will be honored at the event.

Joe R. Kreger, a native of Tonkawa, received his Associate of Science degree from Northern Oklahoma College in 1959 and his Bachelor of Science degree from Oklahoma State University in 1961.

Following his tenure at NOC and Oklahoma State University, Kreger worked in administrative support positions in the purchasing and geophysics departments of Continental Oil Company while continuing to raise cattle.

Kreger left Continental Oil in the early seventies to establish Kreger Equipment, a state-wide wholesale livestock equipment business which he operated until 2001. Since that time, his efforts have been devoted to the cattle ranching enterprise.

At age 56, he began writing poetry born of life experiences. Often referred to as "Cowboy Poetry," his works were passed around, and requests for performances started to come in from farm

Northern Oklahoma College alumni Joe R. and ranch organizations, schools and churches. This developed into a heavy speaking schedule that required travel from Texas to Nebraska and Iowa. For a number of years, Joe authored Joe Kreger, Class of 1959, and Tara Tucker a poetry column in the "High Plains Journal." His work has also been displayed in numerous other periodicals.

> In 1988 Joe was appointed "Poet Laureate of Oklahoma" by Governor Frank Keating. He continued to perform poetry presentations for a number of years, but with the constraints of ranching and advancing age, he became somewhat inactive in poetry activities.

> Then, in 2021, Governor Kevin Stitt appointed Joe to the Laureate position once more, making him the first poet to have received this appointment twice, and by two different governors. Now, Joe is traveling across the state once more. Kreger has been active in Christian Life Church for most of his life. He has taught Sunday School most of the time for a span of around fifty years and has served as Deacon, Elder and Trustee to the present time.

> A graduate of Tonkawa High School, Vaughn earned her Associate Degree in Business Administration from Northern Oklahoma College in 1989. She went on to earn her Bachelor of Business Administration in Marketing at the University of Central Oklahoma and then earned a Master of Public Health at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center.

Dr. Vaughn has practiced as a registered nurse for over 20 years and has served in the U.S. Army Reserve for over 28 years. Shortly after joining the Army Reserve in 1993, she attended nursing school, eventually earning her PhD in Nursing from the University of Texas at Tyler in 2019. Dr. Vaughn currently serves as a registered nurse at the VA Eastern Colorado Health Care System working in the area of Community Care. She is also a Lieutenant Colonel in the Army Reserve where she is currently serving as a Public Health Nurse with the 350th Civil Affairs Command. She is board certified in Advanced Public Health Nursing.

Vaughn has taught in higher education as a Nursing Instructor for Delmar College ADN program and adjunct nursing faculty for Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Dr. Vaughn has also served as a full-time Clinical Assistant Professor and Interim Director of Nursing for University of Houston at Victoria where she awarded the Johnson Foundation Endowed Professorship.

Vaughn currently resides in Centennial, Colorado. She is married to Cory Vaughn of 28 years and they have four amazing daughters: Madelyn, Sophia, Sarah, and Jaclyn. Her mother, Marion Tucker, served as a Vice President for Information Technology at NOC and currently resides in Blackwell, Oklahoma. tertainment.

The 2002 team will be recognized for reaching the NJCAA Division 2 World Series. The Jets finished 43-23 in 2002 and finished third in the World Series.


All NOC Enid baseball alumni are invited to the event.

The Jets host NOC Tonkawa in a double header starting at 1 p.m. The recognition will be between games of the twin bill.


Raydon Leaton was the head coach for the Jets who reached the World Series in the program's second year.



Northern Oklahoma College is providing free basic income tax return preparation for students, NOC employees, and area residents through April 14 at NOC Tonkawa.

Singles or families making less than \$58,000 per year qualify for the free service.

dation with the Strategic Plan for NOC."

Vice President for Enid Jeremy Hise explained a new partnership that NOC Enid has established with Northwestern Oklahoma State University for a fast track program to help elementary education students graduate faster to place more teachers in the work force. Students will be able to complete the elementary education program in 3 ½ years. He said there will be meetings with elementary education students later this month where they can learn more about the program.

Dr. Edgington also reported regarding enrollment that NOC has scheduled targeted enrollment dates for incoming freshmen in specific programs (athletics, livestock judging, etc.). He added that NOC will be enrolling students in communities where NOC officials can answer questions and assist students with the enrollment process.

Vice President for Student Affairs Jason Johnson reported that NOC has not had any positive COVID-19 the past four weeks. Dr. Harris

reported that NOC is removing the 70% capacity limit on attendance for campus events.

Dr. Harris also provided an update regarding "Building a Better NOC," an initiative where students, faculty, and staff have provided input for improvements to NOC. He reported some of the input from the college full-time faculty and staff, from meetings on all three campuses.

Harris also provided information to the regents regarding recommended changes in the direction of the NOC Foundation.

Before the meeting, the NOC Board of Regents met with three NOC Stillwater students, Megan Pickering, Catherine Miller, and Pablo Jaramillo. Pickering is a President's Leadership Council student while Miller and Jaramillo are Gateway Guides. The three students shared with the regents about their experience at NOC Stillwater and their future plans.

The next meeting of the NOC Board of Regents is Wednesday, April 27 in the President's Large Conference Room at 1 p.m.


NOC Tonkawa offers summer science and technology workshops
