

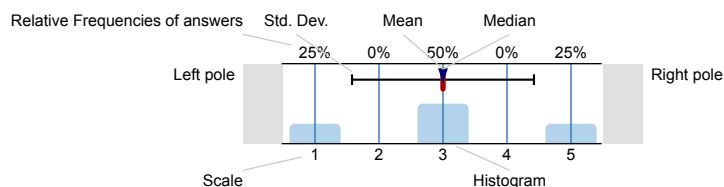

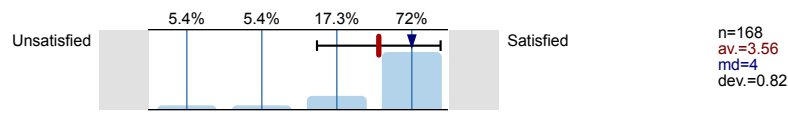
2.4) Looking at the key phrase "accessible" in our mission statement above, how well did NOC live up to its mission?

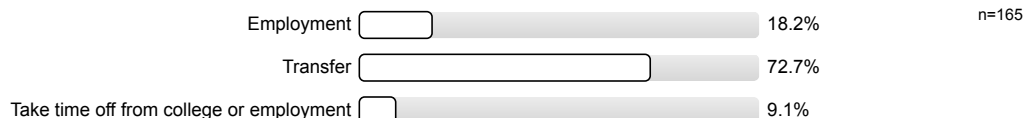
