Franklin Chang-Díaz

Franklin Chang-Díaz, the American Physicist worked on controlled fusion and fusion reactor design. He specialized in Applied Plasma Physics from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and received the doctorate degree from the same university. He became an astronaut in 1981 and later worked at NASA, as well.



Carmelo Anthony

Anthony, who's father is Puerto Rican, is the greatest Latino basketball player of all time. He's a 10-time NBA All-Star, has four Olympic medals (three gold and one bronze), and a NCAA national championship under his belt (he single-handedly made Syracuse champs in 2003). No one even comes close.





Roberto Clemente

Arguably the greatest beisbolero (baseball player) to ever don the Pittsburgh Pirates uniform, #21 was a 15-time All-star who led his team to two World series (1960 and 1971). Hess also one of 31 players to get 3,000 hits. One of the first Latinos enshrined at Cooperstown, Clemente tragically died in a 1972 plane crash that was delivering aid to the victims of an earthquake in Nicaragua.





Ellen Ochoa

Ellen Ochoa, the astronaut and 1st Hispanic woman to go to space pursued her research on information processing from Sandia National Laboratories and NASA Ames Research Center. She is also a co-inventor on patents in optics, object recognition and image processing.

Other Hispanic scientists including Mario J. Molina, who stated that CFC'S are harmless and César Milstein, one of the fathers of modern medicine to develop the first monoclonal antibodies in 1975 are Hispanic scientists. Baruj Benacerraf, Jacinto Convit, Luis Alvarez are a few Hispanic scientists who also made their contributions to the world.
