

Distinguished Alumni Award Recipients

Dr. Jim Appleman, Jeff Medders and Willie Street, MPAS, PA-C, have been chosen as the Northern Oklahoma College Distinguished Alumni for 2023.

The announcement was made by the NOC Director of Alumni and Community Relations, Kayla Wooderson.

Appleman, NOC Class of 1975, is the Co-Founder at Primmune Therapeutics and has published over 70 scientific articles. He currently resides in San Diego, California.

Medders, NOC Class of 1983, is the owner of Geronimo Productions which produces more major cowboy events than any others including 10 days of the NFR in Las Vegas. He currently resides in Jenks, Oklahoma.

NOC Employees, Students, Alums, and Veterans participated in the Veterans Day parades in Ponca City and Enid.






Dear Alumni and Friends:






