Evaluation Criteria	75% or more of students tested will be rated at “competent” (level 4 of 6) or above.
2021-2022 Results	Fall 2021 - 412 out of 436 students (94.5%) scored a 70% or better. Spring 2022 – 136 out of 141 students (96.5%) scored a 70% or better.
Interpretation of Results for 2021-2022	Fall 2021 shows an increase from Fall 2019 when we recorded data last. Spring 2022 shows an increase from Spring 2019 when we recorded data last.
Reflection of Results for 2021-2022	While we saw increases from the last set of recorded data, we are beginning a hopeful rebound from effects from the pandemic. We have realized that we must address our students differently to accommodate for the academic losses that will be tied to the pandemic for several more years.
Actions for Fall 2022 Based on Results	Condense the current rubrics into one rubric to encompass writing skills & critical thinking. Change the verbiage on the rubrics and the scale of assessment to 1-5 instead of 1-3 to allow better use of collected data. Increase the benchmark to 80% for this next year with the possibility of reaching 85% in the future. The fourth assignment will be a documented essay, using a documentation style of choice. The essay will be at least 3 pages in length and contain at least 2 sources.

2021-2022 Results	Fall 2021 – 120 out of 147 students (82%) scored a 70% or better Spring 2022 – 419 out of 453 students (92.5%) scored a 70% or better
Interpretation of Results for 2021-2022	From 2020-2021, there has been a decrease from 91.5 % to 87.5%.
Reflection of Results for 2021-2022	Student assessments typically trend lower in the Fall Semester, but our data collection during the pandemic was not consistent. We are realizing that we must address our students differently to accommodate for their academic losses during the pandemic.
Actions for Fall 2022 Based on Results	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The new assessment system will focus on what has been our historically lowest areas of student achievement. 2. The new assessment system will allow us as a department to have two areas of "Evaluation Criteria," which will allow us to report our findings more specifically related to problem areas. 3. We will, therefore, raise the criteria for the new assignment 2 to 80%, which will allow us to see if we are experiencing grade inflation or something like that. 4. With Assignment 1, then, we can set a reasonable criteria of maybe 75% and see how we are doing with that one problem area.
