Jets Soccer Take-Off Event set for Sept. 20

NOC Jets Soccer will be officially welcomed to Enid and the Advance Soccer Complex on Sept. 20 in Jets Soccer Take Off Event.

The event starts at 3 p.m. with short remarks set for 4:30 p.m. Then, the Jets host Connors State College at 5 p.m. for a women's game and 7 p.m. for the men.

The Sept. 20 event will have activities including facility tours, children's games, vendor booths, NOC Booths (Athletics, Bookstore, Alumni/Community Relations, Recruitment). Remarks will be provided by NOC Enid Vice President Jeremy Hise and Athletic Director Alan Foster and Advance Soccer Complex Manager Mike

Steinke.

NOC currently plays their home games at the \$15 million complex which has six natural grass fields and one turf championship field with a press box, electronic scoreboard, and seating for 1400 person.

These fields can be reconfigured to allow all age group's proper size fields, from PeeWee to adult league. The complex also has a clubhouse complete with four locker rooms, conference rooms seating 60 people, an indoor futsal field, a concession stand, public restrooms, offices and more.

The complex is located at 1520 Garland Road.

Art Exhibit opens in Tonkawa

Oklahoma high school students are displaying artwork at Eleanor Hays Art Gallery, NOC Tonkawa, from Sept. 5- Oct. 6 in conjunction with the Oklahoma Arts Institute's *Tour de Quartz* exhibition.

The forty paintings and photographs featured in *Tour de Quartz* were created during the 2023 Oklahoma Summer Arts Institute (OSAI), a prestigious arts academy held each summer at Quartz Mountain State Park & Lodge in southwestern Oklahoma.

During their time at OSAI, students are immersed in one of eight artistic disciplines and taught by nationally renowned artists. Former faculty members include winners of the Pulitzer Prize and the Academy, Tony, Emmy, and Grammy awards. Visual artist Richard Hull of the Art Institute of Chicago served as drawing & painting instructor for the 2023 Institute,

while Atlanta-based photographer Isaac Diggs instructed photography students.

This summer, drawing and painting students received in-depth training in acrylic painting and the photography cohort explored digital and film photography. The 2023-24 *Tour de Quartz* exhibit reflects the students' OSAI experience, with each student artist represented by one piece of artwork. Students are selected for OSAI through competitive statewide auditions, and every accepted student attends the program on full scholarship. Auditions are held online in January and February.
