Enid planetarium show Oct. 3

The Mackie Planetarium on the Northern Oklahoma College Enid campus will present a planetarium show Tuesday, Oct. 3 at 7 p.m.

Visitors will be introduced to the night sky over Enid and point out constellations and planets in the evening sky. They will also see the locations of over 3000 stars with known planetary systems. "We will point out a star in the constellation Cygnus the swan with a very unusual light curve that may tell us that something is in control over the star's energy output," said planetarium director Fritz Osell.

The planetarium show for this month is "Two small pieces of Glass," which will feature the history of the development of telescopes and use by amateurs

Visitors will also see a cartoon about the Greek myths of Perseus and Andromeda.

Osell also teaches astronomy at NOC Enid.

The show is free for the public but non-perishable foods are accepted as a donation. The show is for all ages.

The festival is free and open to the public.





Soccer teams reaching the half way mark




