

Labyrinth Exhibit open at KPAC Gallery

LABYRINTH: Labyrinths in Art and Life is on display at Eleanor Hays Art Gallery, NOC Tonkawa, from November 15, 2023 – January 26, 2024.

Curated by gallery director Audrey Schmitz, over forty paintings, drawings, sculptures and photographs in the exhibit feature designs inspired by historic labyrinth pathways as well as original creations made by current NOC art students and alumni.

Visitors will also learn about the history of labyrinths and their variations in design and function dating from more than 4000 years ago.

According to a recent article by Faith Hari in the Oklahoma Magazine, "Despite its mysterious origins, the labyrinth is one of the most distinct manmade designs, appearing in places all over the world for thousands of years. Although its winding pattern may resemble a maze, a true labyrinth has only one path that leads to and from its center."

Seven large-scale photographs in the exhibit feature permanent Oklahoma labyrinths found at University of Central Oklahoma, Edmond; Mercy Health Center, OKC; Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Durant; Phillips Theological Seminary, Tulsa; Oklahoma State University, Stillwater and Heart in the Park in

Centennial Park, Tonkawa.

The materials used to create these walking paths include stone, bricks, plants, grass, paint and pavers.

Along with pathway-inspired paintings, drawings and sculptures, NOC art students collaborated on a large-scale "art" labyrinth based on the NOC Maverick logo.

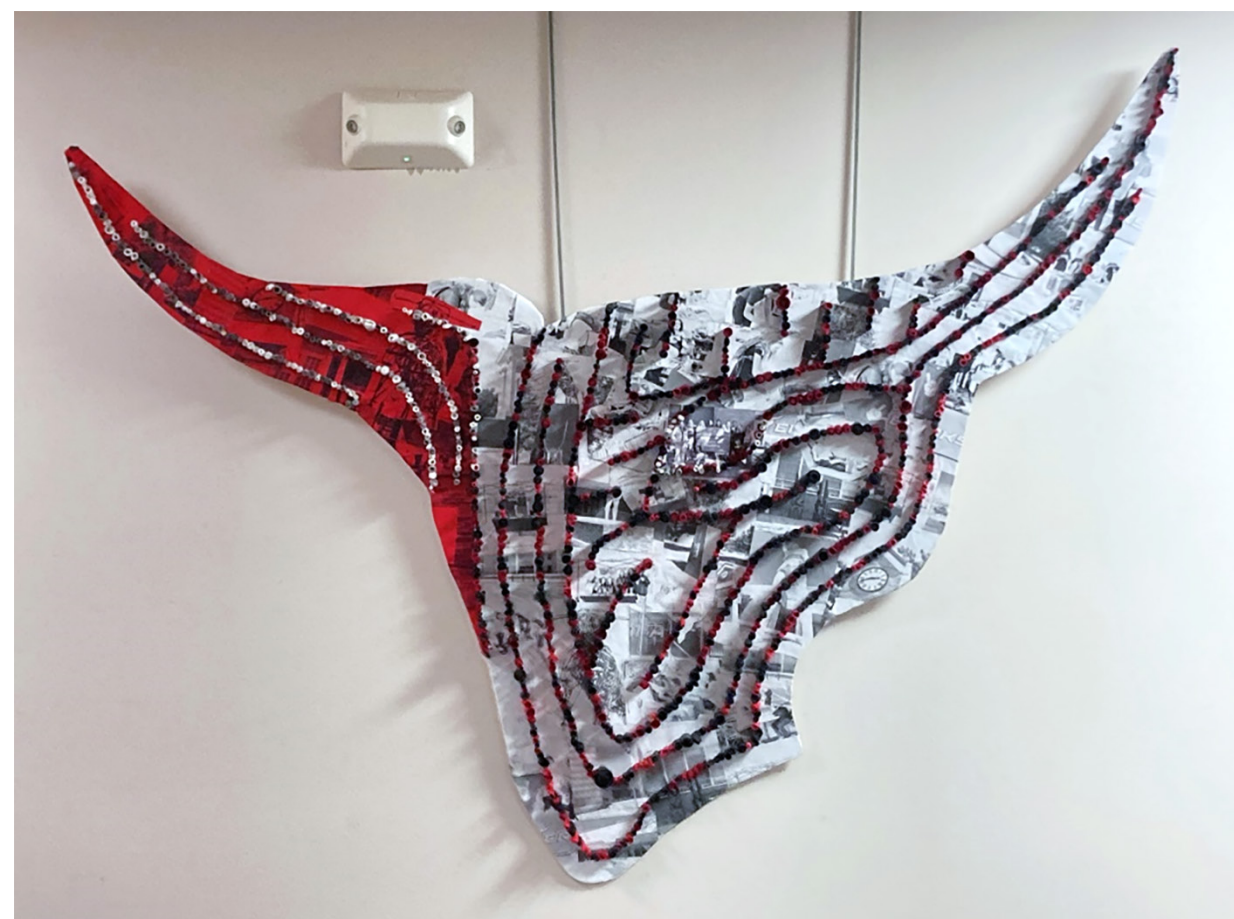
Titled *Maverinth Collabrinth*, the work is a collage of student photos with a "walking" path separated by hundreds of red, black and gray hand-coiled papers.

Art instructors Audrey Schmitz and Jason McNaughton lead students to explore the potential of labyrinth design in their 3-D and 2-D Fundamentals of Art courses in the current fall semester.

Eleanor Hays Art Gallery, located in the Kinzer Performing Arts Center, is open 1 p.m. - 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and during evening and weekend events in the KPAC Auditorium.

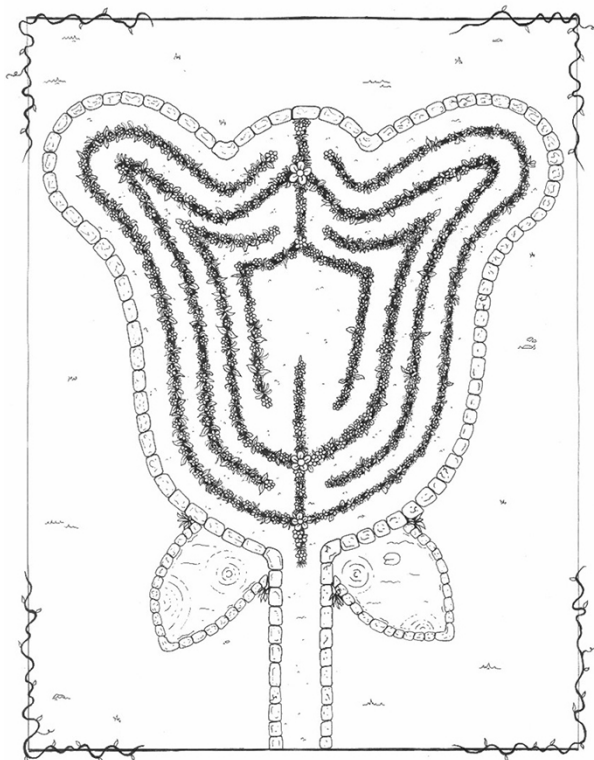
The exhibit will be open for viewing during the Fine Arts Concert set for Sunday, Dec. 10, at 2 p.m.

Nursing students attend white coat ceremony at NOC Enid

The Northern Oklahoma College Division of Nursing held a Fall White Coat Ceremony Tuesday in NOC Enid's Montgomery Hall.

The first White Coat Ceremony was created by Dr. Arnold P. Gold in 1993 to bring a focus on human caring back to the practice of medicine. The ceremony has expanded from medical schools to multiple healthcare disciplines, including nursing. During the ceremony, students are cloaked and recite a professionalism pledge to acknowledge the importance of human caring and the need to keep patients at the center of that care. The cloaking ceremony symbolizes the passing of the nursing profession to a future generation who have the responsibility to provide compassionate care with the most up-to-date evidence throughout their careers, leaving the profession better off when they leave than when they began.

"The white coat ceremony honors nursing's traditions and acknowledges the equal contri-

butions nurses at all levels make to humanistic caring healthcare practices," said NOC Nursing Division Chair Dr. Nikole Hicks. "The placement of the ceremony for NOC nursing students marks their transition from the practice lab to patient care settings within our communities."
