NOC Enid hosts NASA X-59 rollout

The Mackie Planetarium at Northern Oklahoma College Enid held a Public Watch Party Friday.

NOC Division Chair for Engineering, Physical Science, and Process Technology Dr. Frankie Wood-Black said this activity was made possible by NOC's involvement with NASA.

As part of NOC's watch party, several items were made available for use by students, teachers and aircraft enthusiasts including coloring sheets, paper airplane patterns, and paper desk models.

"I am very excited about this opportunity as NASA has helped to fund upgrades to our facilities and which allows for these types of events to be possible," she said. "It is just a natural fit for NOC and the City of Enid."

Lockheed Martin is the manufacturer of the aircraft. According to their website, the Lockfor the roll-out of the new NASA X-59 aircraft heed Martin Skunk Works® team is solving one of the most persistent challenges of supersonic flight – the sonic boom. The X-59 will be used to collect community response data on the acceptability of a quiet sonic boom generated by the unique design of the aircraft. The data will help NASA provide regulators with the information needed to establish an acceptable commercial supersonic noise standard to lift the ban on commercial supersonic travel over land.

This breakthrough would open the door to an entirely new global market for aircraft manufacturers, enabling passengers to travel anywhere in the world in half the time it takes today.

NOC was one of 12 post-secondary locations in the United States hosting the rollout.
