

Ari Fleischer to speak at Spring Lectureship April 2

Former White House Press Secretary, President Ari Fleischer Communications, and FOX News Contributor Ari Fleischer will speak at Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa on Tuesday, April 2, as part of the Carl and Carolyn Renfro Spring 2024 Renfro Endowed Lectureship Program.

The event is sponsored by the Carl and Brenda Renfro/Renfro Endowed Lectureship Program and Northern Oklahoma College/NOC Foundation. The dinner will be held at the Renfro Center starting at 6:30 p.m.

Tickets may be purchased on a first come, first served basis for the event beginning Tuesday, March 12, at 9 a.m.

As a former White House Press Secretary, Ari Fleischer was the primary spokesperson for President George W. Bush and delivered the

daily White House briefings from 2001 to 2003. He served as spokesman during the historic presidential recount, September 11th, two wars and the anthrax attack.

His best-selling book, *Taking Heat*, details his years in the White House and reached #7 on *The New York Times* best-seller list. His most recent book, *Suppression, Deception, Snobbery, and Bias: Why the Press Gets So Much Wrong – And Just Doesn't Care* was released in July 2022.

Since leaving the White House, he manages Ari Fleischer Communications, a company that helps corporations and sports organizations with their communication and media needs.

He has worked for a variety of major companies and leading sports leagues, teams, schools, and individual athletes as well. He graduated

from Middlebury College.

A reserved table with seating for eight may be purchased for \$500, which includes dinner in the Renfro Center and Fleischer's lecture. Individual tickets are available for \$25 each.

Seats are available at no charge for the lecture which will be livestreamed into the Renfro Center classrooms and/or the Walcher Conference Center at NOC.

Women’s History Month in Enid

Northern Oklahoma College celebrated Women’s History Month on Thursday with a presentation by Enid school administrator Dr. Lyntel A. Murphy at the Gantz Center.

Dr. Murphy is an elementary principal at Eisenhower Elementary on Vance Air Force Base. Murphy celebrated the roles of women in leadership in an interesting way but perfect for an elementary principal.

She read excerpts from children’s books which she said can not only inspire students but adults alike.

“Effort is the path to achievement,” she said. “You have to have the desire with a belief in yourself.”

“You have no idea how good you really are,” she said. “You are here in the moment and anything is possible.”

Murphy has lived in Enid since 2010 where she started as an elementary teacher and later

became a school administrator.

She moved to Enid when her husband, Craig, was assigned to Vance Air Force Base in 2010.

Before becoming an educator, Murphy was in the United States Air Force stationed all over the world working in various aircraft groups as an aircraft mechanic.

Dr. Mary Ann McCoy, chairman of the NOC Diversity Committee, explained the history of Women’s History Month which was set in March as part of Title IX in 1972.

She called Dr. Murphy “a trailblazer.”

Vice President for NOC Enid Jeremy Hise praised Murphy, calling her an inspiration for women everywhere.

Dr. Charmaine Munro, another member of the diversity committee, read Murphy’s biography.

Hise presented Murphy with a gift from NOC after her presentation.

Income tax prep at NOC Tonkawa

Northern Oklahoma College Tonkawa is providing free basic income tax return preparation for students, NOC employees, and area residents every Thursday starting Feb. 8 at NOC Tonkawa.

Singles or families making less than \$64,000 per year qualify for the free service.

Trained tax preparers from the NOC Business Division and area volunteers will be available for tax assistance each Thursday beginning Thursday, Feb. 8. Taxpayers also have an option to prepare their own basic federal and state tax return using the free e-filing software.

Cara Beth Johnson, Business division chair said, “This is a great opportunity for our students to provide a community service and gain tax preparation experience.”

The Cultural Engagement Center (CEC) is hosting the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

(VITA) program every Thursday through April 11. The CEC will be closed March 18-22 for spring break and for inclement weather. The CEC is located in the Vineyard Administration/Library building.

Interested parties need to bring a photo ID for all filers; Social Security cards and birthdates for taxpayer, spouse, and dependents; W-2 forms; 1099 forms; receipts for childcare costs, education expenses, and other deductions; checking account and routing number for refund; and 1095-A, -B, or -C healthcare coverage or exemption.

Tax preparation is done by appointment only. Please contact Cara Beth Johnson at 580.628.6340 or carolyn.johnson@noc.edu. Tax preparers are available from 5 p.m. - 8 p.m. No drop off’s will be accepted, individuals must be present during tax preparation.

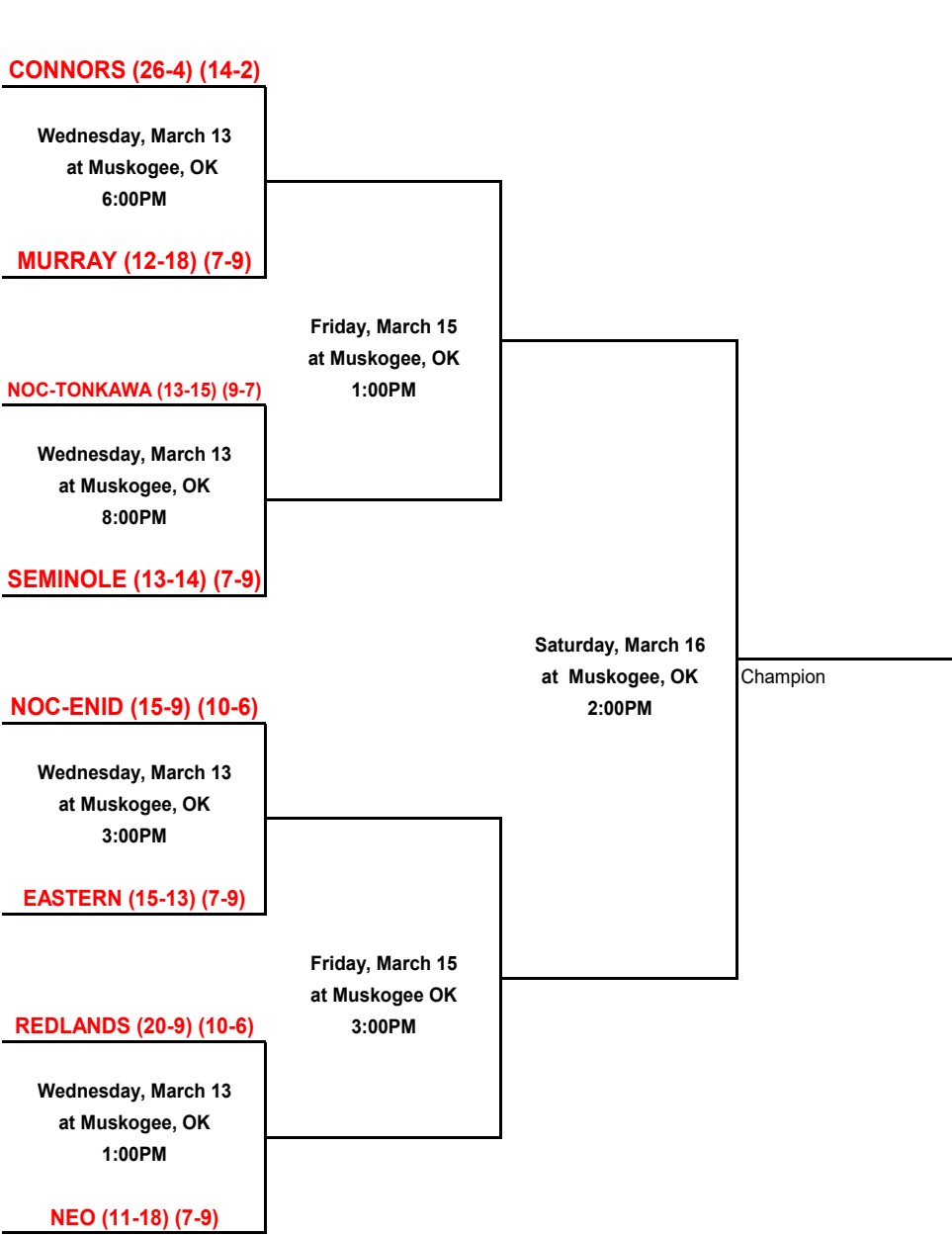

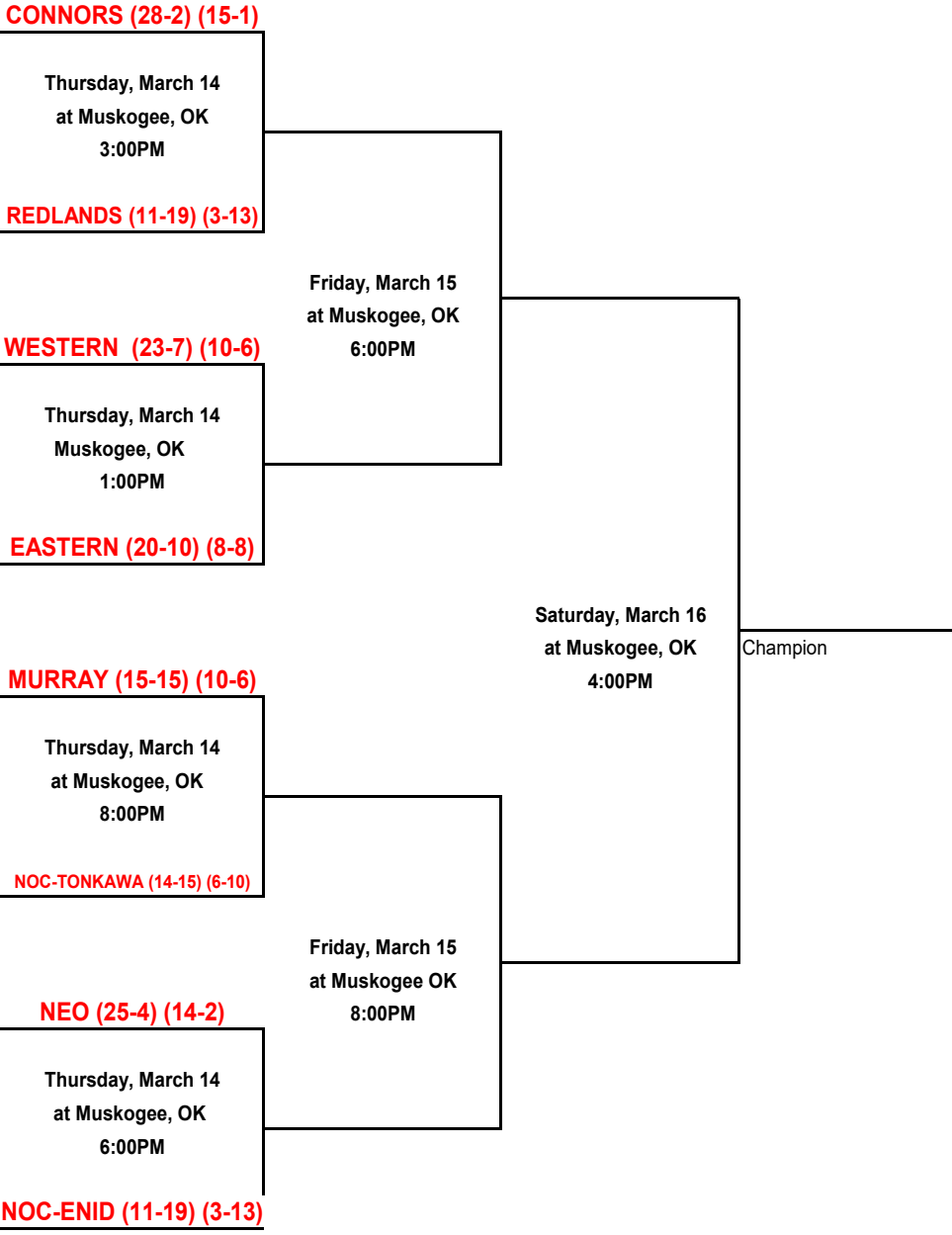
