

Planetarium Show set for Tuesday

The September NOC Enid Planetarium show at the Mackie Planetarium will be offered on Tuesday, Sept. 3 at 7 p.m.

The September show will present the night sky over Enid during autumn and point out where constellations, planets and other interesting objects may be found in the evening sky.

Osell said the show will highlight features in the southeastern sky in early evening. The planet Saturn will be visible in the constellation Aquarius. Osell will point out stars having known planetary

systems

The feature show is entitled "From Earth to the Universe." Visitors will see how astronomy has developed over time and how the view of human's place in the universe has changed as a result.


Osell said that visitors will take a tour of the planets in the solar system.

Students will take professional photographs and learn about the pre-engineering and nursing programs.



The Enid Student Nurses' Association (SNA) held its first meeting this week where exciting plans were made for the upcoming year.






Jets 25th baseball reunion Sept. 14
