'Pride & Prejudice' at KPAC through Sunday

Northern Oklahoma College Division of Fine explore these themes than through COMEDY! Arts presents Pride and Prejudice at the Kinzer Performing Arts Center, October 4-6, 2024, Friday-Saturday at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday at 2

Pride and Prejudice, by Kate Hamill is based on the novel by Jane Austen, and is directed by Emily Rose Parman.

According to Parman in her director's notes, "The questions I always ask myself when choosing a play to direct are - "Why this play?" and "Why this play NOW?" Usually, I have an answer that deals with current events, or the presence of a deeper theme that I'm really interested in exploring. That's not untrue in the case of Pride and Prejudice, but if I'm being honest, my "whys" were as follows: I love Jane Austen. I love Kate Hamill. I love contemporary updates of classic stories that keep the spirit of the original while not being afraid to have fun and be ridiculous. I needed some ridiculous in my life."

"The cast and I have spent a lot of time talking about how this story is not a romance," she added. "It IS a romance, but as far as Jane Austen herself was concerned the "romance" is secondary to the social and political commentary that surrounds it. The romance is the candy coating covering the very real and frightening social and financial circumstances that surround the Mr. Bennet -- Sunday Reynolds women in this play. Well, what better way to Mrs. Bennet -- Tim Muniz

(SPOILER ALERT: If everyone gets married at the end of the play, it's a comedy. Just ask Shakespeare.)"

"Speaking of Shakespeare, Jane Austen is similar to Shakespeare in that her stories continue to endure because of their universality, Parman added. "There is a reason her works are adapted time and time, and time again, and that is simply because we continue to relate to them in very real ways. Although living in a world that seems remote in time and place, Jane Austen's characters have experiences and emotions that are familiar to us. They misjudge people based on appearances, they're embarrassed by their parents, they fight with their friends, they flirt and they fall in love. They deal with loss and grief and shame and disappointment. They recover and find ways to move forward in their lives. They live, and we get to live with them and through them.

It is our hope that you will live with us through this play, laugh with us, and love us.

Yep.

That's right.

Live. Laugh. Love."

Northern Oklahoma College is seeking nominations for the 2024 NOC Distinguished Alumni Award.


Nominations are due Nov. 1, according to Kayla Wooderson, Director of Alumni & Community Relations.
