NOC 125th anniversary celebration set for Oct. 3

Silent auction, raffle to raise scholarship money at NOC's quasiquicentennial

In commemoration of Northern Oklahoma College's quasiquicentennial (125th) celebration, the Northern Oklahoma College Foundation is sponsoring a silent auction and raffle.

The silent auction and raffle will be held Saturday, Oct. 3, at the Renfro Center on the Tonkawa campus from 3:30-5:30 p.m. Tickets to the event are \$25. Heavy hors d'oeuvres will be served. The event is for patrons 21 and older.

More than 50 items will be available in the silent auction, including OSU Football Suite Tickets, a TS Fork Gift Certificate, a fire pit, "Farmer's wife" basket, and many others.

The raffle prize is a Louis Vuitton Diane designer bag valued at \$2,700. Raffle tickets are \$10 each or 12 for \$100. The drawing will be held during intermission of the Quasiquicentennial Concert on Saturday, Oct. 3, at 6:30 p.m.

Funds raised at the event will benefit the First-Generation Scholarship and Program Support.

The permanently restricted scholarship en-

dowment fund, created in January 2024, was established to provide financial assistance to selected students who are the first in their immediate family to attend and graduate from a two-year college or university and whose parents or legal guardians do not possess an associate or bachelor's degree.

The scholarship was created and endowed for students who may not qualify for financial aid but could benefit from additional funding to help offset education-related expenses.

"As the daughter of a first-generation college student, I am so incredibly appreciative of the generosity of this donor," NOC President Diana Morris said. "My dad's community college experience completely changed the trajectory of his life, and therefore mine. This scholarship will improve the quality of life for many families for generations to come."

According to Candy Oller, NOC director of

development and planned giving, the anonymous donor who established the scholarship was a student who was not eligible for financial aid and paid her own way through college without assistance from family.

Oller added that the donor worked multiple jobs to make ends meet and, at times, wanted to give up but persevered. Now in a position to help students who may need financial assistance, the donor hopes the scholarship can take some weight off their shoulders. By knowing that someone cares enough to give back, the donor hopes to make their college experience

a little easier.

Other quasquicentennial events include an exhibition at the Eleanor Hays Art Gallery inside the Kinzer Performing Arts Center, opening Sept. 22, and the Quasquicentennial Concert at the KPAC's Dineo Heilmann Auditorium at 6:30 p.m. Oct. 3.

NOC Historical Art Exhibition celebrates 125 Years

In celebration of Northern Oklahoma College's 125th anniversary, Eleanor Hays Art Gallery will open its doors for an Historical Exhibition, September 22 – December 8, 2026, in the Kinzer Performing Arts Center on the Tonkawa campus.

Gallery Director Audrey Schmitz has curated a diverse collection of artifacts dating from 1901 when Central Hall was constructed as a landmark building. Objects on view in the lobby area include a stone mason's mallet used in the construction of Central Hall, ashes from Wilkin Hall's destructive 1914 fire, 1930s era typewriter and drafting set Dineo Heilmann's original clarinet and personal sheet music, vin-

tage Roustabouts costumes, Maurice Brewer's 1931 Football Jersey and cleats, historic sports trophies, 1916 book of student art work and the official Presidential Medallion. A selection of college yearbooks, *The Maverick* student newspapers, performing arts programs and art exhibition posters are also on display.

Regents receive fall semester updates

Northern Oklahoma College regents received updates on fall enrollment, campus projects, the college's 125th anniversary celebration and other activities during their Sept. 16 meeting in Enid.

Regents also approved a new fee schedule for open records requests. Vice President for Development and Community Relations Sheri Snyder said the change was prompted by an increase in requests and the additional employee time required to fulfill them.

Vice President for Enrollment Management Dr. Rick Edgington reported that fall enrollment is slightly below fall 2025 levels. He also reported that NOC has 548 concurrent students representing 40 entities.

Jeremy Hise, vice president for NOC Enid, reported that work is underway on the Athletic Training Education Center. Fundraising also continues for the Failing Field Renovation Project, with NOC seeking to raise \$375,000 that will be matched by a donor to complete the project.

Snyder reminded regents of NOC's 125th anniversary celebration Oct. 3, which will include a silent auction and purse raffle, art exhibition and concert. She also reported that an NOC Scholarship Task Force has been created to explore ways to better utilize scholarship funds.

Vice President for Academic Affairs Ashley Moore said the semester is off to a good start as she settles into her new position. Moore said she is continuing to learn more about NOC faculty and academic programs while identifying

opportunities for future improvement.

Dr. Marsh Howard, vice president for NOC Stillwater, reported increased participation in Get Going with Gateway compared to 2025. Howard said the student orientation program helps students transition into the fall semester at NOC Stillwater.

Vice President for Student Affairs Jason Johnson reported that students are settling into the fall semester. He credited Dean of Students Ryan Paul at NOC Tonkawa and Dean of Students Renna Bowers at NOC Enid for their work hiring and training new student affairs personnel.

President Diana Morris introduced NOC Enid President's Leadership Council students, who shared information about themselves and why they chose NOC.

Morris also introduced Jets men's basketball coach Chris Gerber, who led NOC Enid to the Elite Eight at the 2026 NJCAA National Tournament in Hutchinson, Kansas, and Bowers, who oversees student affairs on the Enid campus.

Morris provided regents with updates on NOC's Strategic Plan and preparations for the Higher Learning Commission accreditation visit scheduled for November 2027.

Regents also approved the financial report.

The next meeting will be held Wednesday, Oct. 21, at 2 p.m. in the President's Large Conference Room in the NOC Tonkawa Administration Building.

NOC pre-engineering, nursing students attend professional development day

Northern Oklahoma College pre-engineering and nursing students attended a professional development day Sept. 4 on the NOC Enid campus.

The professional day was led by NOC Division Chair for Engineering, Physical Science and Process Technology Dr. Frankie Wood-Black, along with Rachel Kroemer and Lerna Deyirmencian from the NOC Nursing Division.

During the workshop, students learned how to build a success plan and prepare for their future careers. Students participated in interactive sessions focused on how reflection, communication and understanding personal learning styles can help them along their career pathways.

Other topics included lifelong learning, re-

sume writing and opportunities available to students at Northern Oklahoma College, in surrounding communities and through NOC's community partners.

"Northern Oklahoma College provides this workshop annually at the beginning of the year to help students prioritize extra- and co-curricular activities," Wood-Black said. "This allows them to identify critical workplace skills that they can obtain by participating in clubs and organizations and taking advantage of opportunities announced by faculty and staff."

"What helps our students stand out is that they take advantage of these types of opportunities

to build workplace skills in addition to the knowledge they obtain through their normal coursework.”

NOC Nursing Division Chair Dr. Vickie Crouch said the workshop is part of the nursing program’s commitment to student success and professional development.

“As part of the Northern Oklahoma College nursing program’s commitment to supporting student achievement, professional development and transition to practice, nursing students participated in this professional workshop focused on career readiness and preparation for entry into the health care workforce,” Crouch said.

“Through this hands-on experience, students strengthened their professional identity, increased their confidence and gained valuable skills to effectively market themselves as beginning professional nurses in the competitive health care field.”

Crouch said the workshop also supports several outcomes of NOC’s nursing programs.

“The professional workshop supported the NOC Nursing program’s outcomes related to effective communication, professional role development, leadership and transition to the role of the beginning registered nurse,” Crouch said. “Students developed and refined professional resumes and cover letters that effectively communicated their educational preparation, clinical experiences, competencies and accomplishments.

“Through structured interview preparation and mock interview experiences, students practiced professional communication, responding to behavioral and clinical interview questions, appropriate professional attire and strategies for confidently articulating their strengths and readiness for practice.

“The workshop also provides evidence of the program’s ongoing efforts to promote career readiness, student success and achievement of program outcomes.”

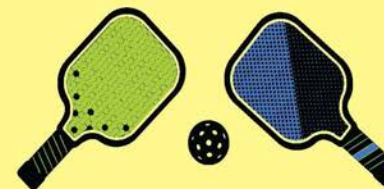

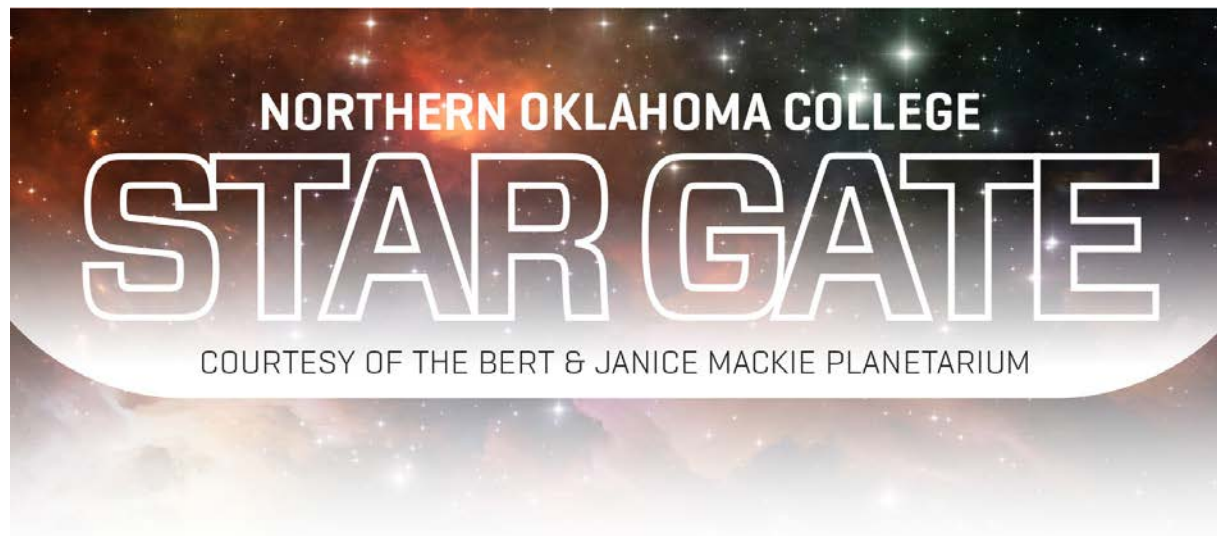

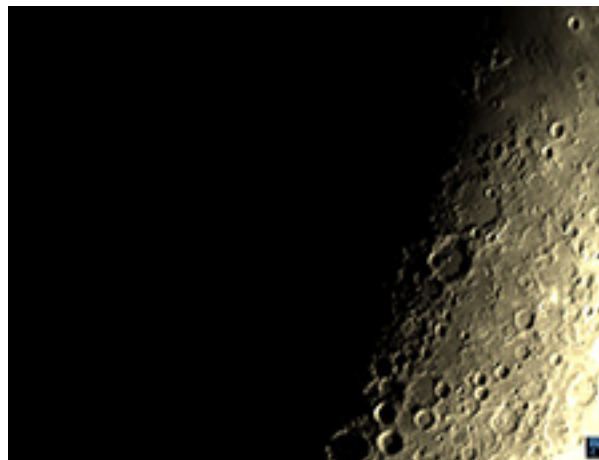
This Week's Viewing Conditions:

The Moon: The Moon is waxing and will reach First Quarter on September 18. The dark skies will make for excellent viewing conditions.

Weather: Check the forecast! It looks like we might have some clouds to contend with as well as a drop in temperature.

Highlights for the Week of Friday, September 18 to September 25, 2026

This Week – Look for the Teapot in the southern sky around 8 p.m. - 8:30 pm. This Teapot is special as it appears to be steaming, due to the presence of the numerous stars of our Milky Way Galaxy. Thus, this is a fun one to spot and it is actually pointing toward the Galaxy's center. The Teapot is an asterism which is a bit different than a constellation. There are 88 official constellations, or an official group of stars. An asterism is an obvious pattern or group of stars with a popular name. (earthsky.org/astrono-

It's time to prepare for the International Observe the Moon Night, which will be on September 19. This event is timed to hit around the first quarter, as this gives good viewing opportunities along the Moon's terminator, that line between night and day.
