NOC celebrates 125th anniversary with Oct. 3 concert

Northern Oklahoma College will celebrate 125 years of education, music and community with a free Quasquicentennial Concert Saturday, Oct. 3, at the Kinzer Performing Arts Center on the NOC Tonkawa campus at 6:30 p.m.

The evening is dedicated to and celebrating the 125th Anniversary of the founding of Northern Oklahoma College - its roots as University Preparatory School preceding Statehood, and its growth into today's four campuses and outreach to thousands of students.

Special tribute will be paid to this theater's namesake: Dineo Heilmann, NOC Fine Arts chair emeritus, former Roustabout and Northern Distinguished Alumnus, who's contributions to NOC, this campus and the greater musical community of north central Oklahoma and to hundreds of students and colleagues are immeasurable. Heilmann's legacy of passionate education, principled administration, fair adjudication, talented performances and loving friendships will endure and inspire future generations for decades.

The concert will feature Northern Distinguished Alumnus and Tonkawa native Jerry Steichen as conductor and host, along with guest pianist Dr. Thomas Lanners, NOC Fine Arts faculty, the Roustabouts and a 57-member professional orchestra.

"This concert gives us an opportunity to celebrate not only Northern's 125-year history, but

also the people who have made music and the arts such an important part of that history," Steichen said. "Bringing so many musicians with longstanding connections to Northern back to Tonkawa makes this a particularly special evening."

The professional orchestra includes musicians who participated in many of NOC's annual Gala concerts. The Gala tradition began under former NOC President Dr. Joe Kinzer with the dedication of the Performing Arts Center and continued 24 years through the tenure of former NOC President Dr. Cheryl Evans.

A highlight of the program will be Lanners' performance of George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue" on NOC's nine-foot Steinway concert grand piano.

Lanners served nearly 30 years as chair of the Piano Department at Oklahoma State University. His performance also highlights a piece of Heilmann's legacy at Northern, as Heilmann

led a lengthy effort to have the Steinway completely overhauled and restored.

"The Steinway has a special place in the history of music at Northern, and having Dr. Lanners perform 'Rhapsody in Blue' on it is a wonderful way to showcase both the instrument and the tradition of excellence that has been built here," Steichen said.

NOC Fine Arts faculty will also be featured throughout the evening, including Dr. Eddie Dixon, Chad Anderson, Shannon Varner and Brandon Haynes.

The Roustabouts will celebrate their own place in Northern's history with a musical journey spanning the group's founding in 1963 through today. The medley was arranged by Haynes and will be narrated by NOC Vice President for Enrollment Management and Registrar and former Roustabout Dr. Rick Edgington.

The concert is part of NOC's larger 125th anniversary celebration recognizing the institution's

beginnings as University Preparatory School prior to Oklahoma statehood and its growth into Northern Oklahoma College.

The anniversary celebration also includes an exhibition curated by Audrey Schmitz highlighting Northern's first 125 years.

Steichen said the concert is intended to reflect the generations of faculty, students, alumni and community members who have contributed to Northern's musical tradition.

"Some of the musicians performing have been part of Northern concerts for many years, while others represent the current generation of faculty and performers," Steichen said. "That combination of past and present is exactly what a 125th anniversary celebration should be."

Concert attendees are encouraged to arrive early to view the anniversary gallery exhibition which opens at 5:30 p.m. A reception will follow the concert, giving guests an opportunity to visit with Roustabouts, musicians and guest artists.

The concert is free with no tickets required. Doors will open at 6 p.m. for the concert.

Earlier in the day, the NOC Foundation is hosting a Silent Auction/Purse Raffle from 3:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. at the NOC Tonkawa Renfro Center. Proceeds from the auction and raffle will raise funds for the First-Generation Scholarship and Program Support.

NOC to partner with OU for Enid Dental Hygiene program

ENID, Okla. — Delta Dental of Oklahoma on Tuesday, Sept. 22, 2026, announced a more than \$2.5 million gift to Great Salt Plains Health Center to fund expansion and enhancement of its dental clinic.
The \$2,852,050 will allow renovation of a 6,558-square-foot space for GSP Health to increase its patient operatories from five to 17, as well as enable technology upgrades to the facility at 231 S. 30th in Enid to be used as a remote learning site and clinic training ground for dental students at both the University of Oklahoma College of Dentistry and Northern Oklahoma College.
“This is something that’s been in the works for two years, and I’m glad it’s coming to fruition at this time,” said Paul M. Mullasseril, DDS, MS, dean of the University of Oklahoma College of

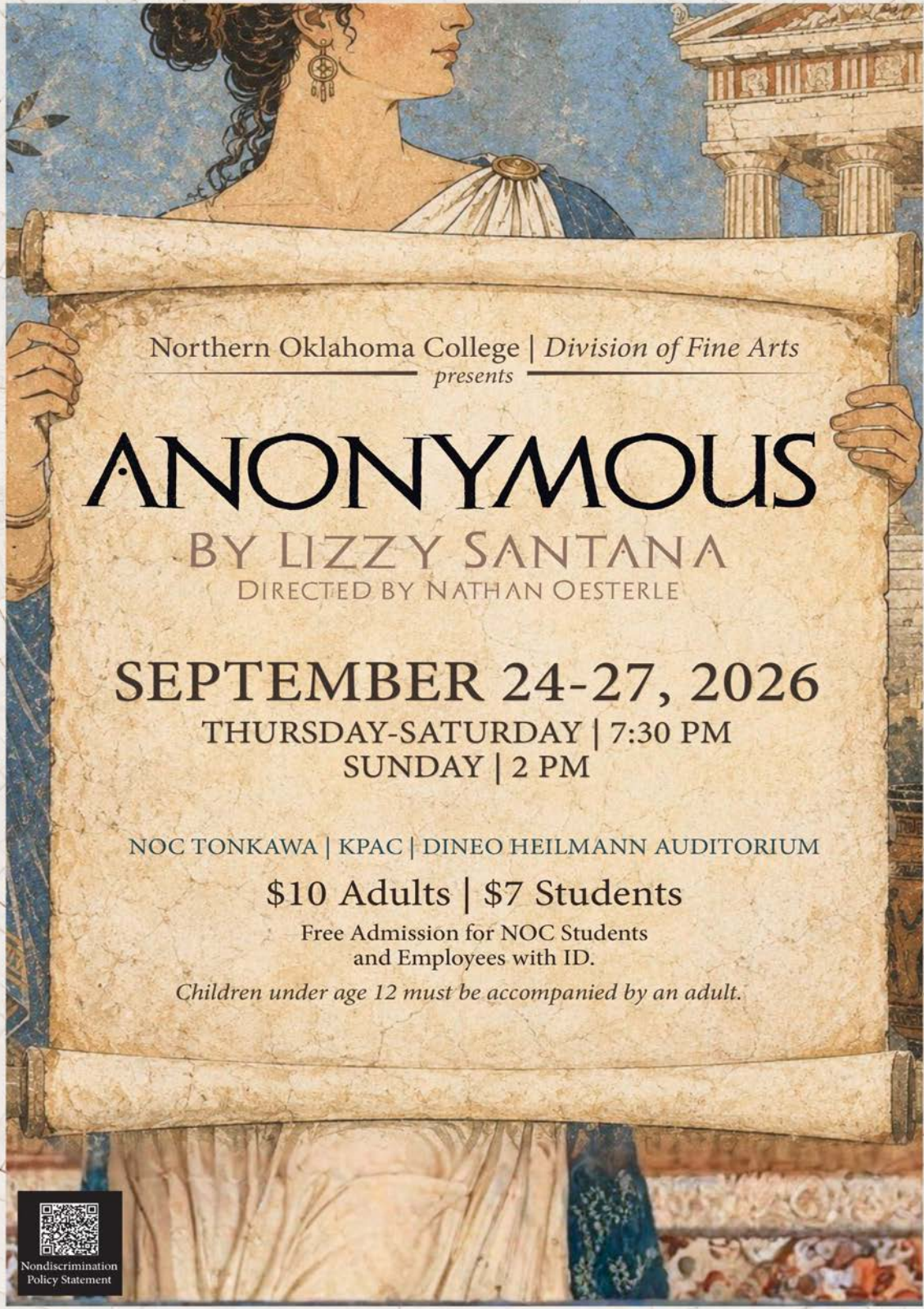
Dentistry.
Oklahoma has about 49.8 dentists per 100,000 people in the state, with the national average being 61 per 100,000, Mullasseril said.
“And if you look into the dental hygiene, you look around the country, each and every day, each and every population will tell you that there are not enough dental hygienists in the country, and the same is the case here in Oklahoma,” he said. “So we have a workforce issue, and we also have access-to-care issues. There is a lack of proper distribution of dentists and dental hygienists in the state of Oklahoma.”
This new setup, he said, will allow both the number of dental hygienists and access to care to be addressed.
Mullasseril said that when looking at the num-

ber of patients coming to Oklahoma City for dental services, 500 had come from the Enid area over the last year.

“So hopefully this will help keep these patients here and provide care closer to home,” he said.

Diana Morris, president of Northern Oklahoma College, said the college saw a need to address the dentistry issue several years ago. The lecture portion of the program will happen on NOC Enid’s campus, with the clinical portion at GSP Health. That’ll help temper the financial burden of local students who might have previously had to travel for training.

“To be able to grow our own right here in Northwest Oklahoma, (that’s) huge, so I’m just super excited about being able to invest in the workforce of Enid and Garfield County, for all of Northwest Oklahoma,” Morris said.

John E. Gladden, president and CEO of Delta Dental Oklahoma, said the need for dental care in Northwest Oklahoma is great.

“Once completed, this new training facility will simultaneously provide care for those in need while training the future professionals who will hopefully apply their skills to the residents of Northwest Oklahoma,” he said.

The concept behind remote learning and treatment centers began in 2002 in Bartlesville, Gladden said.

“The Oklahoma College of Dentistry had a vision that we were able to train dental professionals in rural areas using newly developed, at

the time, audio-visual transmission technology and provide learning,” he said. “There was a greater probability that local students would remain in those areas and practice dentistry. So together we pioneered distance learning, overcoming the multiple technological challenges of that time — we think nothing of them now.”

Further efforts expanded to Ardmore and Weatherford, and now come to Enid.

“So, it is a sincere pleasure for me to be up here this morning to share the good news about this venture,” Gladden said.

Construction on the new expansion will begin next month, and the clinic is expected to be open in time for the 2027 school year.

“There is significant need for expanded dental services in our rural and underserved region, and this new facility will allow us to provide more patients with comprehensive, quality care close to home,” said Tim Starkey, MBA, FACHE and CEO of GSP Health. “We are incredibly grateful to Delta Dental of Oklahoma for this generous investment for the people of northwestern Oklahoma.”

Great Salt Plains Health Center began in Cherokee in 2007 and provides low-cost medical, dental and behavioral health care to communities in Northwest Oklahoma. In addition to its locations in Cherokee and on South 30th in Enid, there are two other locations in Enid, as well as Canton and Medford. To learn more about its services, go to gsphealth.org.

NOC Historical Art Exhibition Celebrates 125 Years

In celebration of Northern Oklahoma College's 125th anniversary, Eleanor Hays Art Gallery will open its doors for an *Historical Exhibition*, Sept. 22 – Dec. 8, in the Kinzer Performing Arts Center on the Tonkawa campus.

Gallery Director Audrey Schmitz has curated a diverse collection of artifacts dating from 1901 when Central Hall was constructed as a landmark building. Objects on view in the lobby area include a stone mason's mallet used in the construction of Central Hall, ashes from Wilkin Hall's destructive 1914 fire, 1930s era typewriter and drafting set Dineo Heilmann's original clarinet and personal sheet music, vintage Roustabouts costumes, Maurice Brewer's 1931 Football Jersey and cleats, historic sports

trophies, 1916 book of student art work and the official Presidential Medallion. A selection of college yearbooks, *The Maverick* student newspapers, performing arts programs and art exhibition posters are also on display.

The East Gallery features a large collage of historical photographs along with sixty framed *Faces of NOC*, a spotlight of alumni success and testimony of the college's impact on the lives and careers of former students.

Historic photographs of campus buildings are featured in the West Gallery along with photographs of the college's founding father, James H. Wilkin, 15 presidents, and 3 acting/interim

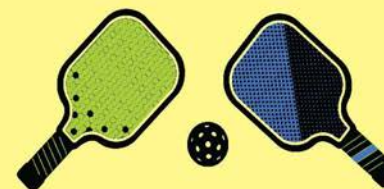

students who may not qualify for financial aid but could benefit from additional funding to help offset education-related expenses.

“As the daughter of a first-generation college student, I am so incredibly appreciative of the generosity of this donor,” NOC President Diana Morris said. “My dad’s community college experience completely changed the trajectory of his life, and therefore mine. This scholarship will improve the quality of life for many families for generations to come.”

According to Candy Oller, NOC director of development and planned giving, the anonymous donor who established the scholarship was a student who was not eligible for financial aid and paid her own way through college without assistance from family.

Oller added that the donor worked multiple jobs to make ends meet and, at times, wanted to give up but persevered. Now in a position to help students who may need financial assistance, the donor hopes the scholarship can take some weight off their shoulders. 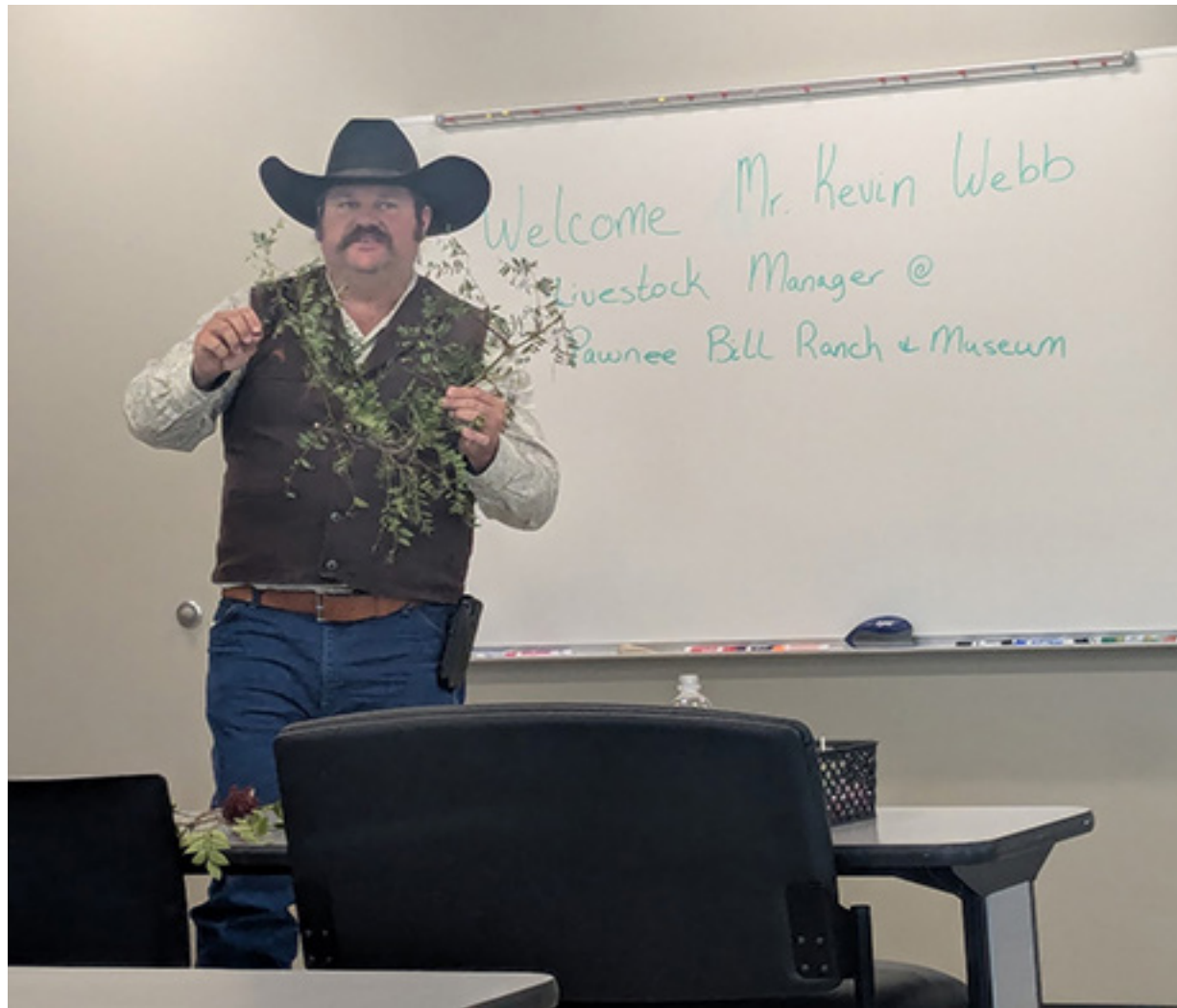
